License & Certification Renewal

Acupuncturist - The Fall 2023 Renewal Season is winding down. December 1st marked the start of the renewal grace period. Licensees with November 30, 2023 expiration dates still have a little more time to renew but at an increased fee rate of \$651. The fee has increased \$100 because your renewal is considered late. PLEASE NOTE that Licensees who were selected to participate in the CEU audit must submit proof of CEU compliance before their renewal application will be approved.

Licensees that don't renew by December 31st must submit a reinstatement application for the fee rate of \$751. The reinstatement application also requires that Licensees submit proof of the required CEUs, including the Implicit Bias training mandated by the Maryland General Assembly in 2021. Auricular Detoxification Specialist

- The Fall 2023 Renewal Season for Auricular Detoxification Specialists (ADS) started December 1st. ADS' with December 31, 2023 certification expiration dates have been able to submit Renewal Registration Applications since November 1, 2023. The registration renewal fee is \$25.00 for 2 years, if submitted by December 31, 2023. As of January 1, 2024 your registration will be considered late and require Registration Reinstatement. The registration reinstatement fee is \$100. As well, don't forget your obligation to complete Implicit Bias training.
