

- Why Receiving Centers?
- A safe place for law enforcement to keep consumers out of criminal justice system
- Provides the ability for law enforcement to return quickly to patrol duties


What do they look like?


- 36 Assessment Site Locations 32 Community Services Boards
- Assessment Sites in areas covering about 78% of population.
- \$10.5 million allocated by General Assembly
- About \$285,000 average cost per site/year








The first General Assembly CITAS programs (3)



10 Sites located in office environments (including CSBs)




23 Sites co-located in or adjacent to EDs

What does it look like?

- TDO is written for facility where Consumer is to be detained
- OR
- For medical facility to receive care prior to arrival at inpatient facility



TRANSPORTATION

- 2015- Virginia DBHDS Pilot Program
- Mount Rogers Community Services Board (Galax, Va.)]
 - TDO transports were accomplished using alternative transportation during the project pilot
 - Very supportive feedback from partner agencies

ALTERNATIVE TRANSPORTATION

- Under an ECO, custody may be transferred to a facility provided that it is:
 - (i) is licensed to provide the level of security necessary to protect both the person and others from harm,
 - (ii) is actually capable of providing the level of security necessary to protect the person and others from harm, and
 - (iii) in cases in which transportation is provided by a lawenforcement agency, has entered into an agreement or memorandum of understanding with the law-enforcement agency
