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History: The Calvert County Local Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council was established pursuant to Subtitle 10 of Title 8 of the Health-General Article. This legislation required each county to have a local alcohol and drug abuse council and to develop a local plan that includes the plans, strategies and priorities of the county in meeting identified needs of both the general public and the criminal justice system for alcohol and drug abuse evaluation, prevention and treatment services.

Our Vision: A safe and drug free Calvert County supportive of recovery.

Our Mission: To provide a comprehensive and collaborative continuum of care that promotes the health, resilience, and quality of life of our community members.

Accomplishing the goals and objectives is contingent upon receiving adequate funding.

Guiding Principles:

1. All goals and objectives incorporate evidence supported practices, are outcome driven and expect accountability.
2. Stakeholders are engaged in all goal areas.
3. Behavioral Health is inclusive of Substance Abuse and Mental Health.
4. All goals will consider the needs of special populations (e.g., homeless, young families, criminal justice).

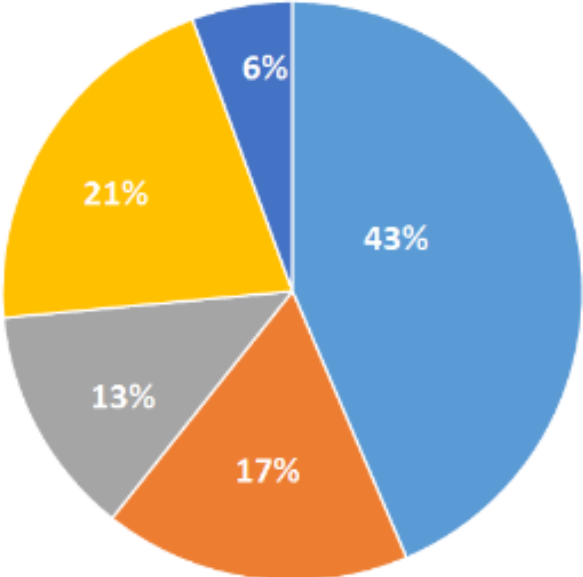

Goal 1: Reduce the potential negative consequences of the abuse/misuse of alcohol and other drugs and encourage the wellness of county residents through promotion, prevention and early intervention services and activities.

Objective 1 Use a comprehensive prevention approach, including the application of universal, selective, indicated and environmental strategies, to reduce alcohol, tobacco and other drug related consumption and consequences.

Action Steps

1. Increase prevention program offerings.
2. Work to reduce youth access to and use of alcohol and other drugs through alliance with social service organizations, including DSS, behavioral health treatment providers, criminal/juvenile justice agencies, law enforcement and civic groups.
3. Provide opportunities to educate the community on alcohol and other drugs through media campaigns, presentations and trainings.
4. Conduct community forums/focus groups regarding alcohol and other drug abuse issues.
5. Continue the efforts of the Prescription Drug Abuse Abatement Council (PDAAC).

Progress 1.1 million impressions on multimedia drug and alcohol awareness campaigns, including Geo Mapping, billboards (Prince Frederick and Dunkirk), radio ads, television, social media and direct mail distribution.

Over 800 Facebook followers on the Act Now Calvert Page with an average of 200 weekly impressions. Page content includes prevention, treatment, resource, recovery support and community event information.

Approximately 225 Calvert County Middle School students were given OMPP presentations in partnership with Calvert County High School student health and social groups.
