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Welcome and Introductions

Commission Chair Cabbage welcomed all attendees to the Commission meeting. Commissioners introduced themselves.

Approval of May 20, 2020 Minutes

No corrections were made to the minutes. Minutes were approved.

Discussion of Commission Vision and Purpose:

The Commission discussed creating a vision and purpose for the commission in order to track progress. The Commissioners brainstormed ideas for a vision and commented on how the commission is meeting its goals. Several Commissioners identified a disconnect with knowing each other and the communities each Commissioner represents, it was decided that adding a meeting to the calendar to focus on fostering connection between Commissioners. The additional meeting scheduled for October 14th at 1-3 pm. A spreadsheet of the ideas will be shared with Commissioners for additional comments.

Discussion of Local Jurisdictions

Commissioners Kulp and Treger led the discussion of collaboration efforts with local suicide coalitions. There has been one meeting with Carroll County, Washington County, Harford County, and Lower Eastern Shore Suicide Coalition leads and will have ongoing quarterly meetings with the county suicide coalition. The commission plans to gather information of county initiatives, the barriers and needs of the counties in order to provide needed support. The Commissioners discussed the benefits and barriers to this approach. It was recommended that the Commission also connects with the Local Management Boards, Local professional boards and the Midshore Collaborative.

Suicide Prevention Month

Commissioner Cabbage announced that BHA was creating a Suicide Prevention Month Toolkit and requesting suicide prevention month proclamations from counties that are allowing proclamations currently. Commissioner Himmelberger discussed the difficulties with planning activities for September with COVID-19 and budget constraints. It was recommended that other organizations be reached out to such as AFSP who conducts walks every year. Commissioners Macri and Guerrero Vazquez discussed the need for culturally and linguistically appropriate resources and materials for community populations.

Workgroup Updates:



Commissioners Kulp and Treger provided updates on the joint meetings of the training and lethal means workgroups. The joint workgroups decided to collaborate to achieve relevant goals on providing training to Behavioral Health Professionals and PCP's on suicide prevention and access to lethal means through the promotion of CALM and ERPO trainings. The workgroups have started connecting with local suicide coalitions to collect qualitative data on county suicide prevention initiatives. The next steps for the workgroup are to develop a questionnaire to conduct individual meetings with the county suicide coalitions to learn more about their initiatives and barrier, and then develop a presentation of the data collected.

Data Workgroup Updates:

The Data Workgroup provided updates on its focus to improving the reporting of race/ethnicity for Native American suicides, which are often coded as another race or ethnicity. The work group has a schedule in place to routinely share corrected race/ethnicity data available from death certificates. The workgroup has been able to engage with tribal groups to learn about their methodologies for coding race and ethnicity. The plans to reach out to data providers to learn about existing methodologies for determining race/ethnicity has been put on hold due to COVID-19. The Environmental Public Health Tracking Portal has been updated to include a health topic page on suicide. The plans to include geo-mapping information on suicide incidents is moving forward with an initial code written. The Morbidity Data Products have been put on hold as the ICD-10 code for non-fatal intentional self-harm is being validated under CDC guidance (anticipated completion in 2021). The workgroup is in the process of creating a 1 pager with information from the 2017 data from Maryland Violent Death Reporting System (MVDRS). The impact of COVID-19 on suicides was briefly discussed as data is still being collected, although suicide deaths were lower between March and May 2020 compared to 2019.

Action Items:

The State Plan is due on December 1st, with internal review necessary prior. Commissioners are to review State plan and share comments with Natalie who will provide a shared google sheet for comments. The Commissioners are to review and add comments to the list of the Commission's vision and purpose. Commissioners were encouraged to sign up for workgroups: Jen Treger, Amy Kulp and Georgette Lavetsky are leads to contact.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:59 pm.
