House Bill 326 Changed the Board Statute

There are numerous changes in the Board Statute. The amendments changing the licensure requirements for audiologists, hearing aid dispensers and speech-language pathologists are of the upmost importance. Now inclusive in the law effective **October 1, 2007**, any newly hired personnel who provide speech-language pathology services in the public schools , State approved nonpublic school for handicapped children or chartered educational institutions must be licensed as a speech-language pathologist or speech-language pathology assistant. The law does not apply to individuals hired by the schools prior to October 1, 2007. Students enrolled in graduate programs in SLP and AUD are exempted from the license requirement if they are obtaining clinical hours(§-301.(a)(2)). Effective **October 1, 2007**, an applicant for a full license as an audiologist will be required to have a doctoral degree. An audiologist who received a licensed based on a master's degree prior to October 1, 2007 will qualify for a license to practice in Maryland (§2-302.(c)(1)(i). Effective **January 1**, **2008**, all candidates will be required to have a two year degree or diploma from an accredited college or university to apply for a hearing aid dispenser license. Hearing Aid Dispensers will also be required to complete the comprehensive coursework on hearing aid dispensing sponsored by the International Hearing Aid Society prior to sitting for the licensing examination (§2-302.1(a).

The Board has submitted Regulatory changes to the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene Office of Regulation and Policy Coordination. The proposed changes include adopting regulations for **Oral Competency** and **Supervision of Students**. The Speech-Language Pathology Assistant and limited license for Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists Regulations language was amended. The Board is currently working on a **Telehealth** Regulation. After the formal approval of the new regulations they will be posted on the Board's Web site at www.mdboardaudhadslp.org. The Board will print an updated edition of the Law and Regulations as soon as all the regulatory changes are approved. If you have questions you may call 410-764-4725.



The Board amended Regulations 10.41.01.02 -Fees to establish fees for license verification, returned checks and rosters. COMAR 10.41.01.04 Fee Excepttions will exempt current licensees from paying the verification fee. COMAR

As a consumer member, Mrs. Winslow advocated for the public and ensured that the Board was aware of the consumer's perspective.

On July 1, 2007 the Governor appointed four members. Cassandra Peters-Johnson, Ph.D, CCC-SLP, a private practitioner in Bethesda, Maryland, is a speech-language pathologist member. Lisa M. Nelson, Au.D., an audiologist member, is in private practice in Waldorf, Maryland. Kenneth B. Needle, Hearing Aid Dispenser, was appointed to serve the remainder of the four year term of Mr. Perkins which expires June 30, 2008. Mr. Needle practices in Catonsville, Maryland. Arlinda Harris was appointed as a consumer member. .Mrs. Harris is very community oriented and is active in numerous civic and non-profit organizations. Because of her commitment to her community Ms. Harris will be an exceptional consumer member. Collectively, the Board members will improve the State of Maryland by promoting ideas that support healthy communities.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Q-How long will it take the Board to approve my application and issue a license?

A- An application will be approved as soon as **ALL** the documents on the Application Checklist are received. A completed applications includes passing the Law Exam. An applicant for limited licensure will receive a written statement which expires within one year. An applicant for full licensure will receive a license issued by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

Q-Can I have a provisional license pending the approval of my full license so I can start to work?

A- No provisional license is issued. The only exception would be an applicant licensed in another state. In this case the Board gives a verbal approval and/ ora written statement that allows the applicant to work pending the approval of the application and the issuance of a full license. (Refer to 2-305 (c) (3))

Q- What can I do if I have lost my license?

A- Mail to the Board a notarized copy of the Lost License Form with the \$5.00 replacement fee. The Board will issue a duplicate license within 10 working days.

Q- What should I do if I am not sure whether a course or program would be approved by the Board?

A- Not less than 30 days before a program is scheduled, submit to the Board the <u>Application For Approval of Continuing Education Units for Individual</u> <u>Participation</u> .(form on the Web site) Send the completed form, agenda and additional information to the Board.

The National Practitioner Data Bank(NPDB) and the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank(HIPDB)

The **NPDB** receives and discloses information related to the professional competence and conduct of health care practitioners. The **HIPDB** receives and discloses information related to final adverse action taken against health care practitioners, providers and suppliers. When the Board issues a final public Order, the Board is required by Federal Regulations to report the action to the **HIPDB**.

Debra Della-Limited HAD license_ permanently revoked pursuant to Order of Revocation effective July 19, 2007.

Kirsten C. Johnson– Application for SLP license denied pursuant to Order of Denial of Application for Licensure effective September 13, 2007.

Laura Rubinoff– SLP licensee reprimanded and placed on probation for one (1) year with conditions pursuant to Consent Order effective September 13, 2007. Petition for early termination of probation granted, and license restored without restrictions or conditions pursuant to Order Lifting Probation effective February 1, 2008.

Patricia Tschiderer- SLP license suspension for one (1) year stayed; Licensee placed on probation for two (2) years with conditions pursuant to Consent Order effective May 31, 2007.

List for Supervising Speech Language Pathology Assistants

Since the Speech-Language Pathology Assistants licensure program began April 1, 2002, the Board has licensed 17 full Speech-Language Pathology Assistants and 25 limited Speech-Language Pathology Assistants. To ensure that the Speech-Language Pathology Assistants and the Speech-Language Pathologist Supervisors fully understand the licensure requirement and are in compliance with COMAR 10.41.11 the following summary of requirements is provided:

- Delegation Agreement (Form SA6) completed by **each** supervising SLP should indicate the exact address of where the SLP-A is practicing,
- Complete the Alternative Plan for Obtaining Required Clinic Hours (Form A4) and submit for Board approval **before** the clinical observation/assistance starts,
- A full time SLP can supervise two full-time SLP-Assistants (35 hours) and a part-time SLP (less than 35 hours) can supervise one full-time SLP –A (35hours),
- All sections on the Competency Skills Checklist (SA7) must be completed to meet requirements for a full SLP-A licensee and
- All changes in supervision and /or place of employment must be reported to the Board on another SA4 and requires the Board's written approval **before** the change is made.

BOARD DISCIPLINARY INFORMATION

In FY 2007, the Board received 23 complaints. Seven (7)cases were dismissed with no violation of the statute, and one dismissed because the Board did not have jurisdiction over the matter. The Board sent two (2) Cease and Desist letters to individuals who were practicing without without a license. Six (6) Letters of Education and one(1) Letter of Admonishment were

sent. Other cases either have

been resolved with formal

discipline or still are pending

with the Board.

To date in FY 2008 ,the Board has received 5 complaints. Two (2)cases were dismissed with no violation of the statute and the others remain pending with the Board.

Many of the Board's complaints are resolved with informal actions such as a Letter of Education or Letter of Admonishment. Both letters are not a formal disciplinary action, which means the licensee does not have to reveal to any person or report it should anyone ask if the Board has taken any action Board receives future complaints against the licensee, finds that the individual is guilty of a violation of the Law and decides to pursue formal disciplinary action, the Letters of Education and Admonishment can be taken into consideration in determining an appropriate sanction(i.e. probation, reprimand, suspension, revocation or fine).

The Board expects all licensees to practice within the parameters of the law.

The Board of Examiners reports although the law was passed two years ago some audiologists and hearing aid dispensers have not updated their contracts. When a consumer complaint is brought to the attention of the Board, not following the law is grounds for disciplinary action.

- Audiology Alert # I Effective October 1, 2005, all hearing testing listed on a hearing aid sales contract is considered part of the price of the hearing aid and is subject to be included in the 10-20 % withheld from a refund. All diagnostic hearing tests must be billed as a separate item and not included in the hearing aid contract in order for the testing to be nonrefundable.
- Hearing Aid Dispensing Alert#2 Effective October 1, 2005 all hearing aid sales contracts must include the EXACT refundable amount to the patient.
- AUD/HAD/SLP Supervision Alert # 3 Supervising unlicensed persons performing tasks, which require a license, jeopardizes <u>your</u> professional license.
