On February 26, 2025 the Maryland Board of Occupational Therapy Practice (the "Board") received a self-report from licensee Pamela Walasik (the "Respondent"). The Board opened an investigation into the complaints and held a Case Resolution Conference on October 15, 2025.

CONSENT ORDER OF SUSPENSION

Based on the Board's investigation into the Respondent's conduct the Board voted to offer a Consent Order of Suspension to the Respondent in lieu of issuing Charges for violating the Maryland Occupational Therapy Practice Act (the "Act"), Md. Code Ann., Health Occupations ("H.O.") §§10-101 et seq. As a result of that offer the Respondent and the Board agreed to the following Consent Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds that:

On July 20, 2007 the Maryland Board of Occupational Therapy Practice (the "Board")
issued the Respondent license number 05973 to practice Occupational Therapy in the
State of Maryland, the license was active and in good standing at all times relevant to this
Order,

- On February 10, 2025 the Respondent was terminated from employment at Facility 1¹ for drinking alcohol at work.
- 3. On February 26, 2025 the Respondent self-reported to the Board.
- On September 11, 2025 the Respondent met with the Board's investigator (the "Investigator") for a recorded interview
- The Respondent told the Investigator that she drank alcohol the morning of February 10,
 2025 despite knowing she had a full schedule of patients that day.
- 6. The Respondent admitted to treating multiple patients while under the influence of alcohol before attempting to cancel her remaining patients on February 10, 2025.
- The Respondent advised that she did not recall many additional details from February 10,
 2025, but was aware that Facility 1 contacted an ambulance due to her level of intoxication.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that the Respondent violated Md. Code Ann., H.O.. §10-315 which allows the Board to "suspend or revoke a license if the…holder…"

- (8) Provides professional services while:
 - (i) Under the influence of alcohol;

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is hereby:

ORDERED that the license of the Respondent to practice Occupational Therapy in the State of Maryland is hereby SUSPENDED FOR FIVE (5) YEARS WITH ALL BUT A MINIMUM OF SIX (6) MONTHS STAYED and it is further,

ORDERED that when the Respondent petitions to lift the suspension, the Respondent shall appear before the Board prior to the Board's decision to lift the suspension; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent will be placed on a PERIOD OF PROBATION FOR

FIVE (5) YEARS from the date the Board lifts the suspension in this Order, and until the

Respondent complies with the terms and conditions set forth in this order; and it is further

ORDERED that during the probationary period the Respondent shall report to the Board's Impaired Practitioner's Committee; and it is further

ORDERED that during the probationary period the Respondent shall provide all documents, including proof of continued treatment, to the Board's Impaired Practitioner's Committee upon request; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent shall submit to periodic, random urine analysis for the the presence of alcohol or illegal drugs; and it is further

notify the Board in writing that the employer has received a copy of this Order and it is further
