GUIDANCE ON SELF-CARE AND PREVENTION OF INDIRECT TRAUMA TRAININGS

Please submit proposed training with responses to each of the following questions:

- Submit training title, learning objectives, and course description on the specific training.
 Course Outline: Must clearly describe evidence-based content and its relevance to social work.
 Learning Objectives: Should specify what participants will learn and how it applies to their licensed social work practice.
- 2. Explain how learning about self-care or indirect trauma prevention strategies will be incorporated into the social workers' practice.
- 3. Explain how the self-care or indirect trauma prevention training benefits the specific clients in their treatment.
- 4. Ensure self-care and indirect trauma prevention topics align with best practices with documented evidence-based, well researched materials, etc.
- 5. Instructor Qualifications: Bachelor, Master, or Doctorate Degree in Social Work from a Council on Social Work Education accredited program or advanced degree in a discipline that frequently collaborates with social workers (medicine, pharmacy, psychology, counseling, legal, human service management, etc.) and has demonstrable expertise in social work and in the approved program being offered/provided.

SELF-CARE AND PREVENTION OF INDIRECT TRAUMA - ACCEPTED

Bottom line is this training benefits social workers in providing appropriate services to the client/patient.

SELF-CARE AND PREVENTION OF INDIRECT TRAUMA - DENIED

Bottom line is this training cannot be focused on **DOING** specific activities of self-care or the prevention of indirect trauma.

NOTE: Indirect Trauma includes Vicarious Trauma, Burnout, Compassion Fatigue
