FINAL CONSENT ORDER

The State Board of Social Work Examiners (the "Board") charged SHERRY MCDUFFIE, LMSW, License No. 21038, (the "Respondent"), with violation of certain provisions of Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. §§ 19-101, et seq.; (2014 Repl. Vol. and 2020 Supp.).

Specifically, the Board charged the Respondent with violation of the following provisions of § 19-311:

Subject to the hearing provisions of § 19–312 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a license to any applicant, fine a licensee, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the applicant or licensee:

- (2) Fraudulently or deceptively uses a license;
- (4) Commits any act of ...misconduct in the practice of social work;
- (5) Engages in a course of conduct that is inconsistent with generally accepted professional standards in the practice of social work;
- (6) Violates any provision of this title or regulations governing the practice of social work adopted and published by the Board [;].

The Board further charges the Respondent with a violation of its Code of Ethics, COMAR 10.42.03:

- .01 Scope and Purpose.
 - A. This chapter governs the professional conduct of social workers licensed by the Board regardless of whether the service delivery is in person, telephonically, or electronically.
 - B. The objective of this chapter is the protection of the public. The best interest of the public shall be the primary guide in determining the appropriate professional conduct of all individuals whose activities are regulated by the Board.
 - (4) Commits any act of ...misconduct in the practice of social work;

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds that:

BACKGROUND

- 1. At all times relevant to the charges herein, the Respondent was licensed to practice Licensed Masters Social Work (LMSW) in the State of Maryland.¹ The Respondent was first so licensed on June 29, 2015, and her license expires on October 31, 2022.
- 2. At all times relevant herein, the Respondent was employed by a Department of Social Services in Central Maryland.

¹ The Respondent obtained her LCSW-C license in 2020.

COMPLAINT

- 3. On May 23, 2019, the Board received a Complaint (the "Complaint") against the Respondent from the father of the Respondent's son, the Complainant. The Complainant alleged that the Respondent used the Department's computer database to look up personal information on him, his children, and the woman with whom he lives. The Complainant is not on the Respondent's client list.
- 4. As a result of the Complaint, the Department conducted an investigation, which affirmed the allegations in the Complaint, resulting in the Respondent's employment being terminated, as it is against Department rules and ethics to use its database to access information for personal reasons.
- 5. The Board's investigation determined that in May 2019, the Respondent accessed the database at work for personal reasons, using her cell phone to take two screenshot photographs of the information displayed on her work computer—the database. The Respondent admitted that her actions were not part of her official work duties. The Complainant stated that he found out that the Respondent had committed the work violation after she telephoned him, "very upset," and informed him that she had "discovered" information about him, his children, and a woman that he resides with by accessing this information from her work computer. The Complainant believes that the Respondent was able to find information in the database involving a Howard County Department case involving him and his other children, allowing her to see dates of birth, social security numbers and addresses.

- 6. The Complainant visited the Respondent around Mother's Day and confirmed that she had the personal information taken from the work computer on her cell phone as screen shots, including information about the woman he lived with and her children.
- 7. An interview of the Respondent's Supervisor confirmed that it was against Department policy to use one's position as a social worker to gain access to information to use for one's own personal matters and that none of the persons involved on the screen shots were clients of the Respondent.
- 8. The Respondent told the Board's Investigator that she used the database to get the Complainant's "address" for a domestic violence case; however, she acknowledged that there was no police involvement regarding any domestic violence claims.
- 9. As set forth above, by assessing her work database for personal information on her child's father, which included social security numbers and dates of birth of persons who were not her clients, the Respondent violated the Act, pursuant to §§ 19-311(2) (Fraudulently or deceptively uses a license); (4) (Commits any act of ...misconduct in the practice of social work); (5) (Engages in a course of conduct that is inconsistent with generally accepted professional standards in the practice of social work); and, (6) (Violates any provision of this title or regulations governing the practice of social work adopted and published by the Board); and COMAR 10.42.03 .01 (Scope and Purpose. A. This chapter governs the professional conduct of social workers

licensed by the Board regardless of whether the service delivery is in person, telephonically, or electronically, and B. The objective of this chapter is the protection of the public. The best interest of the public shall be the primary guide in determining the appropriate professional conduct of all individuals whose activities are regulated by the Board.)

10. As set forth above, the Respondent violated §§ 19-311 (2), (4) (5) and (6) and COMAR 10.42.03 .01. A. and B.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that the Respondent violated Board's Act and regulations, pursuant to §§ 19-311 (2), (4) (5) and (6) and COMAR 10.42.03.01. A. and B.

<u>ORDER</u>

ORDERED that Respondent's license is hereby SUSPENDED for Six Months and that Suspension is immediately STAYED; and it is further

ORDERED that within six months of the effective date of the Consent Order, the Respondent shall take and pass a Board-pre-approved college-level ethics course which shall not count towards her Continuing Educations Units (CEUs) requirements;

ORDERED that Respondent shall bear all costs of complying with this Order.
and it is further

ORDERED that the effective date of this Order is the date that it is signed by the Board;

ORDERED that Respondent shall obey all laws and regulations that govern the practice of social work in the State of Maryland.

ORDERED that the Respondent shall not serve or continue to serve as a Board Authorized Sponsor, presenter and/or trainer of social work continuing education learning activities, an Ethics Tutor, an evaluator for the Board, or a Board-Approved Supervisor for a period of 5 years from the effective date of this Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that, should the Board receive information that the Respondent has violated the Act or if the Respondent violates any conditions of this Order, after providing the Respondent with notice and an opportunity for a hearing, the Board may take further disciplinary action against the Respondent, including suspension or revocation. The burden of proof for any action brought against the Respondent as a result of a breach of the conditions of the Order shall be on the Respondent to demonstrate compliance with the Order or conditions; and it is further

ORDERED that, for purposes of public disclosure and, as permitted by Md. General Provisions §§ 4-101 et seq. (2014 Vol. and 2020 Supp.), this document consists of the contents of the foregoing Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order, and is reportable to any entity to whom the Board is obligated to report and will be displayed on the Board's website.

I acknowledge that my failure to abide by the conditions set forth in this Order and following proper procedures, I may suffer disciplinary action, possibly including revocation, against my license to practice as a LCSW-C in the State of Maryland.
