Welcome/Introduction Taina Metsa-Mahka, BSN, MBA, DBA	The meeting commenced with Taina extending a welcome to all attendees. Following the welcome, participants introduced themselves and the organizations they represented. The notes from the previous meeting were subsequently approved.	
Cervical Cancer: Guidelines and Prevention Deanna Najera, PA-C, Carroll County Health Department	Deanna Bridge-Najera provided a comprehensive overview of Pap smears, HPV's link to various cancers, including head and neck cancers, and the historical context of Henrietta Lacks. 	 Pap smears examine cervical cells, and their use has significantly reduced cervical cancer deaths. HPV is a virus linked to over 90% of cervical cancer diagnoses, with different strains causing various cancers. HPV vaccination, like Gardasil, is effective in preventing HPV-related cancers and genital warts. Regular annual exams and HPV vaccination (if under 46) are recommended for prevention. 	
9 Healthy Habits of a Community Health Coalition Paul Galonsky, MPA Programs Administrator Maryland Department of Health Cancer Screening Programs Unit	Paul discussed two of the "Nine Habits of Successful Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalitions" developed by the American Cancer Society and the Comprehensive Cancer Control National Partnership. 1. Empowering leadership 2. Shared decision-making Paul explained that empowering leadership involves strong, inclusive leaders who facilitate rather than dominate, building trust and credibility among members. He emphasized that decisions should be made participatorily, with multiple voices and transparency, which fosters accountability and buy-in among coalition members.	Review Nine Habits resource guide

Colorectal Cancer Screening Program:

For Fiscal Year 2026 (FY26), the goal is to:

- Increase the number of new individuals served, through colonoscopies and stool DNA tests.
- Serve 69 individuals.
- Serve 10 male individuals.
- Continue efforts to serve 6 non-Hispanic, Black, and African-American individuals, despite county demographics.

Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program:

For Fiscal Year 2026 (FY26), the goal is to:

- Provide breast cancer screenings to 213 individuals.
- Serve 61 individuals for cervical cancer screenings.
- Serve 7 non-Hispanic, Black, and African-American individuals.
