§ 3-316.1. Injunctive actions

- (a) Authorized. -- An action may be maintained in the name of this State or the Board to enjoin:
 - (1) The unauthorized practice of chiropractic; or
 - (2) Conduct that is a ground for disciplinary action under § 3-313 of this subtitle.
- (b) Who may bring action. -- An action under this section may be brought by:
 - (1) The Board, in its own name;
 - (2) The Attorney General, in the name of this State; or
 - (3) A State's Attorney, in the name of this State.
- (c) Jurisdiction. -- An action under this section shall be brought in the county where the defendant:
 - (1) Resides; or
 - (2) Engages in the acts sought to be enjoined.
- (d) Permissible defendants. --
- (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, an action under this section may not be brought against an individual who is authorized to practice a health occupation under this article.
- (2) An action under this section may be brought against an individual who is authorized to practice chiropractic under this title.
- (e) Proof of damage not required. -- Proof of actual damage or that any person will sustain any damage if an injunction is not granted is not required for an action under this section.
- (f) Action in addition to other penalties. -- An action under this section is in addition to and

not instead of criminal prosecution for the unauthorized practice of chiropractic under \S 3-501 of this title or disciplinary action under \S 3-313 of this subtitle.
