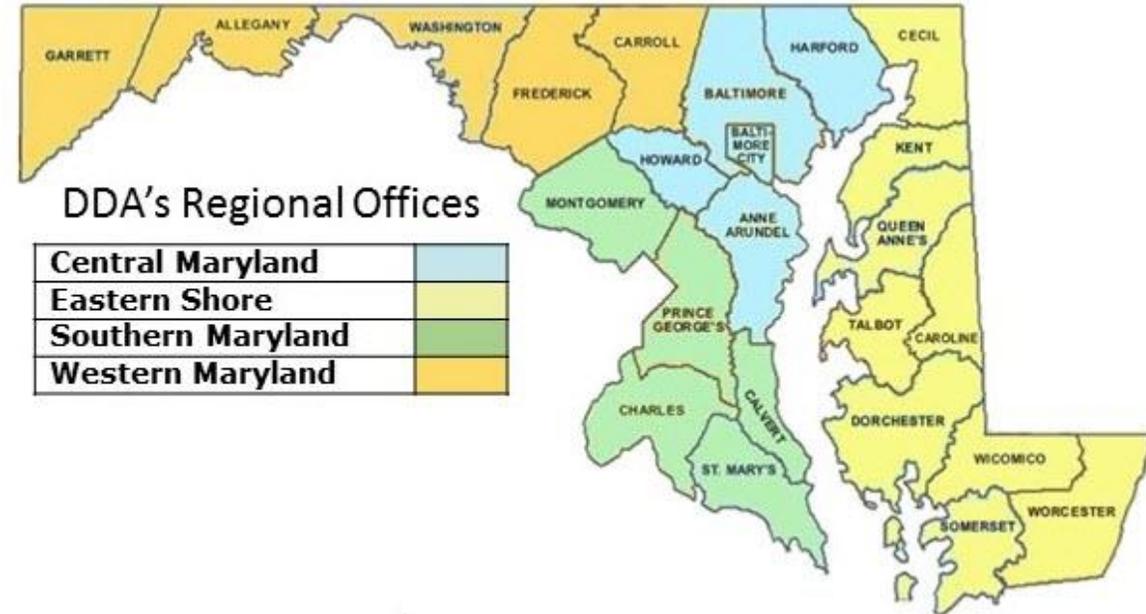

Deputy Secretary's Opening Remarks





DDA's Tracking




There are 17,764 people supported in services by the DDA of which 2% have tested positive for COVID-19.


DDA Tracking







Secondary Transition During COVID-19




Challenges

Autism Waiver (AW) Transitioning Youth (TY) During COVID-19




Challenges

Responses

- Submitted Appendix K
 - *Granted AW flexibilities and increased service hours*
- Coordinated services
- Instituted TY Surveys with AW Service Coordinators
- Enhanced partnerships between AW Service Coordinators and CCS Workers
- Shared tracking spreadsheet on the status of 126 AW participants
- Allowing parent choice to ensure continuum of service delivery


Lessons Learned During COVID-19

any item, device, or piece of equipment used to maintain or improve the functionality of people with disabilities, allowing them to be more independent in education, employment, and community living activities.



WhAT We Do

- Run three AT Libraries across the state (Central Baltimore, Southern Maryland, and Eastern Shore)
- Conduct AT demonstrations with AT Clinicians
- Issue short-term device loans
- Host webinars, trainings, and presentations on AT
- Online equipment reuse exchange (buy, sell, giveaway AT & medical equipment)
- Maryland High-tech AT Reuse Center (housed in the Loan Closet of Howard County)
- Conduct a low-interest financial loan program
- Run the Central Baltimore, Western Maryland and Southern Maryland adapted telephone evaluation centers and assessment program



AT Financial Loan Program

- Provides low-interest loans to Maryland residents with disabilities or their families to buy assistive technology
- Covers all types of AT including vehicles, computers, home modifications, and more
- Loan amounts - \$500 - \$50,000
- Interest rates usually one point below prime
- Approves many loans that would be turned down by conventional lenders
