

DDA's Service Delivery System

The Moore-Miller Administration continues to make record investments in the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA). State funding in FY26 is more than \$1.3 billion, more than two-thirds higher than the funding available three years ago.

This funding will:

- Support new enrollments
- Enable LTSSMaryland improvements
- Enable a moderate rate increase
- Maximize sustainable funding



DDA's Service Delivery System

Focused adjustments to ensure:

- Outcome-driven and sustainable system funding
- Minimize participant life disruptions



Geographical Differential

Proposal:

 Eliminate the "geographical differential" rate currently available in Calvert, Prince George's, Montgomery, Frederick, and Charles counties to preserve, promote, and maximize funding for DDA community services.
