Assistive Technology and Services

Service Updates	 The threshold for requiring an Assistive Technology (AT) Assessment is increased from \$1,000 to \$2,500.
Service Limits	No change
Provider Qualifications	No change
Who can provide	No change



Behavioral Support Services

Service Updates	 Assessment includes communication skills and challenges. Behavior Support Plan goals to be specific, measurable, attainable, relevant, time-based, and person-centered approach. Consultation includes ongoing review in all appropriate environments.
Service Limits	No change
Provider Qualifications	 Provider of behavioral assessment / consultation services must have training and experience in: Analysis of different styles of communication and communication challenges related to behavior. Ethical considerations related to behavioral and psychological services. Positive behavioral supports and trauma informed care.
Who can provide	No change



Community Development Services

Service Updates	 Dedicated 1:1 or 2:1 supports are now based on a person having: A Behavior Support Plan noting specific behavior need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA. A Nursing Care Plan noting specific health and safety need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA. Self-Directed Services staff reimbursement updates.
Service Limits	No change
Provider Qualifications	 Removed requirement for staff to have a High School (HS) diploma or pass a General Educational Development (GED) test.
Who can provide	No change



Community Living - Enhanced Supports

Service Updates	 Dedicated 1:1 or 2:1 supports are now based on a person having: A Behavior Support Plan noting specific behavior need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA. A Nursing Care Plan noting specific health and safety need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA.

Community Living - Group Home

Service Updates	 Dedicated 1:1 or 2:1 supports are now based on a person having: A Behavior Support Plan noting specific behavior need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA. A Nursing Care Plan noting specific health and safety need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA.
Service Limits	No change
Provider Qualifications	 Removed requirement for staff to have a High School (HS) diploma or pass a General Educational Development (GED) test.
Who can provide	No change



Day Habilitation

Service Updates	 Dedicated 1:1 or 2:1 supports are now based on a person having: A Behavior Support Plan noting specific behavior need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA. A Nursing Care Plan noting specific health and safety need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA.
Service Limits	 Service can be provided any day/time of the week.
Provider Qualifications	No change

Employment Discovery and Customization

Service Updates	No change
Service Limits	 Services may not exceed a maximum 40 hours per week, including in combination with any of the following other Waiver program services in a single day: Supported Employment, Career Exploration, Community Development Services, and Day Habilitation services.
Provider Qualifications	No change
Who can provide	No change



Employment Services

Service Updates	 Job development and ongoing job supports billing in 15-minutes increments.
Service Limits	 The limit of 10-hour per day with Employment Services - Ongoing Job Supports is removed.
Provider Qualifications	 DDA required credentials, license, and certifications required. Removed requirement for staff to have a High School (HS) diploma or pass a General Educational Development (GED) test.
Who can provide	 A Relative, Legally Responsible Person, and Legal Guardians can provide this service.*

Environmental Modifications

Service Changes	No change
Service Limits	 The maximum amount of Environmental Modifications is increased from \$15,000 to \$50,000 every three years.
Provider Qualifications	No change
Who can provide	No change



Housing Support Services

Service Changes	 Expanded service to include Assistance with bill paying services (e.g., assistance with setting up and monitoring systems to pay rent, mortgage, utilities and other related housing expenses).
Service Limits	No change
Provider Qualifications	 Training related to creating personal budgets with people with developmental disabilities.
Who can provide	No change



Individual and Family Directed Goods and Services (IFDGS)

Service Changes	 Updates based on Self-Directed Services Act of 2022. Expanded scope of service to include: New items/activities covered under this service (See next slide). Not covered under this service (See next slide). Clarify requirements and criteria for allowable goods/services/activities. IFDGS are purchased from the participant-directed annual budget allocation and must be documented in the participant's record.
Service Limits	 The \$5,000 limit for IFDGS is removed. However, goods or services in excess of \$5,000 require prior authorization by the DDA.
Provider Qualifications	No change

IFDGS: New Items and Activities

- Activities that promote fitness.
- Fees for programs and activities that promote socialization and independence.
- Small kitchen appliances that promote independent meal preparation.
- Laundry appliances to promote independence and self-care.
- Sensory items related to the person's disability.
- Certain safety equipment.
- Personal electronic devices to meet an assessed health, communication, or behavioral need.
- Day-to-day administrative supports.
- Internet services.



IFDGS: Items and Activities Not Covered

- Services, goods or supports that have no benefit to the person.
- Travel adventures.
- Personal clothing and shoes, haircuts, nail services, and spa treatments.
- Exercise rooms, swimming pools, and hot tubs.
- Fines, debts, legal or advocacy fees.
- Contributions to ABLE Accounts and similar saving accounts.
- Country club membership or dues.
- Leased or purchased vehicles.
- Items purchased prior to their approved Person Centered Plan (PCP).

IFDGS: Criteria

- Relate to a need or goal in the PCP.
- Maintain or increase independence.
- Promote opportunities for community living, integration, and inclusion.
- Does not compromise the person's health and safety.
- Provided to or directly exclusive to the benefit of the person.



IFDGS: Requirements

- Decrease the need for other Medicaid services; OR
- Promote inclusion in the community; OR
- Increase the person's safety in their home; AND
- The person does not have the funds to purchase the item or service, and it is not available through another source.

Nursing Support Services

Service Changes	 Self-Directed Services employee training, benefits, and reimbursements added.
Service Limits	 Consultation up to a 4 hour period within a 3 month period. Health Case Management up to a 4 hour period within a 3 month period. Delegation every 45 days or more frequently based on nurses judgement.
Provider Qualifications	 Nurses must attend all DDA provided nurse meetings. (Note: If a training is a requirement, it will be noted on the training announcement.)
Who can provide	No change



Participant Education, Training and Advocacy Supports

Service Changes	No change
Service Limits	No change
Provider Qualifications	No change
Who can provide	 A Relative, Legally Responsible Person, and Legal Guardians can provide this service.*

Personal Supports

Service Changes	 Personal supports include overnight supports. Enhanced rate, dedicated 2:1 supports, and overnight supports are now based on a person having: A Behavior Support Plan noting specific behavior need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA. A Nursing Care Plan noting specific health and safety need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA.
Service Limits	 Personal Support services are limited to 82 hours per week under the traditional model unless otherwise authorized by the DDA.
Provider Qualifications	 Removed requirement for staff to have a High School (HS) diploma or pass a General Educational Development (GED) test.
Who can provide	No change



Remote Support Services

Service Changes	 Service clarification: Remote Support Services does not include electronic audio-visual conferencing software applications reliant on the participant to maintain the connection.
Service Limits	No change
Provider Qualifications	No change
Who can provide	No change



Respite Care Services

Service Changes	 Respite may be used as an emergency back-up plan for unpaid caregivers. Services are billed in 15-minutes increments, daily rate, and camp fees.
Service Limits	No change
Provider	 Organized Health Care Delivery System Providers can now apply to
Qualifications	provide this service.
Who can	 A Relative, Legally Responsible Person, and Legal Guardians can provide
provide	this service.*

Shared Living

Service Changes	 "Level 2" - The person may participate in meaningful day services or have a job. "Level 3" - Various reasons a person may have this level of support and that not all conditions need to be present. Self-directed services budget authority option.
Service Limits	No change
Provider Qualifications	 Removed requirement for staff to have a High School (HS) diploma or pass a General Educational Development (GED) test.
Who can provide	Siblings may provide service.



Support Broker Services

Service Changes	 Expanded role of Support Broker (See next slide). Service is now required if a relative, legally responsible individual, representative payee, and guardian serve as paid staff. Up to 30 additional hours, as needed, can be purchased within the person's total approved annual budget with unallocated funds.
Service Limits	 Funding authorization is for: Initial orientation and assistance up to 15 hours. Support Broker Services up to 4 hours per month.
Provider	 Removed requirement for staff to have a High School (HS) diploma or
Qualifications	pass a General Educational Development (GED) test.
Who can	 A Relative, Legally Responsible Person, and Legal Guardians can provide
provide	this service.*

Support Broker Expanded Role

At the direction of the person, Support Broker Services may assist the person to:

- Defining goals, needs, and preferences.
- Making informed decisions in arranging, directing, and managing services, including personnel requirements and resources needed.
- Development of an emergency backup plan.
- Identifying, accessing, and managing supports, services and resources.
- Independent advocacy to assist in filing grievances and complaints.
- Understanding the responsibilities involved with self-direction.

Provider Qualifications	 Removed requirement for staff to have a High School (HS) diploma or pass a General Educational Development (GED) test.
Who can provide	No change



Supported Living

Service Updates	 Dedicated 1:1 or 2:1 supports are now based on a person having: A Behavior Support Plan noting specific behavior need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA. A Nursing Care Plan noting specific health and safety need unless otherwise authorized by the DDA.

Provider Qualifications	 Removed requirement for staff to have a High School (HS) diploma or pass a General Educational Development (GED) test.

Transportation Services

Service Changes	No change
Service Limits	• Transportation is limited to \$7,500 per year per participant.
Provider Qualifications	 Commercial providers like Uber and Lyft may provide this service and are not required to complete pre/inservice training. Removed requirement for staff to have a High School (HS) diploma or pass a General Educational Development (GED) test.
Who can provide	 A Relative, Legally Responsible Person, and Legal Guardians can provide this service.*

What is the DDA?

The DDA is a State agency. It pays for services and supports for **children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities** and their families in Maryland. People with intellectual and developmental disabilities are also called **people with IDD**.

DDA services and supports are provided in people's homes and in the community.

GUIDELINES FOR SERVICE AUTHORIZATION and PROVIDER BILLING DOCUMENTATION

*All text in red indicates added/revised language since the prior release date

Effective: July 1, 2023



Meaningful Day Minimum Hours

- In-person PCP meetings are NOT required—text, email, video.
- If nothing else is being revised, there should be quick turnaround on approval.
- Less than 6 hours—Consistent vs. life happening.



Service Implementation Plans (SIP)

Beginning July 1, 2023:

- One SIP per agency for ALL goals.
- SIP is NOT required for SDS participants.
- Regions will only review that SIP is present and complete.
- IT platform flexibility, upon DDA approval.
- SIP form being updated with directions, examples, key, and table for all goals.



Detailed Service Authorization Tool (DSAT)

For all PCPs with an effective date of July 1, 2023:

Providers who have transitioned to LTSSMaryland Billing	Provider Billing via PCIS2
DSAT is no longer required	DSAT is required
