Inside DHMH Building Security

- Uniformed Officer at the Main Security Desk Entrance 24/7
- Security post at loading dock.
- Screen all visitors per protocol standards and verify identity/destination.
- Multiple safety zones/rings (turn-styles, card access, keys, etc.)
- Monitor the CCTV for activity inside and outside the premises.
- Maintain active radio communications with outside security personnel.
- Conduct CCTV or Video Escorts to and from the site.


