Re: Maryland's Biological Agents Registry (BAR) Program and Transfer Forms

Pursuant to Maryland State law (Health-General Article, §§17.601 et seq., Annotated Code of Maryland and the Code of Maryland Regulations [COMAR] 10.10.11), the Laboratories Administration's Office of Laboratory Emergency Preparedness and Response (OLEPR) maintains Maryland's BAR Program. The federal Select Agent Program requires registered facilities to complete an APHIS/CDC Form 2 (Request to Transfer Select Agents and Toxins) document every time a select agent is received or transferred. State regulations require registered facilities to submit documentation (either an APHIS/CDC Form 2 or a MDH Form 2) to the BAR Program within 24 hours of a completed transfer or receipt of a select agent.
