Re: Surrender of Massage Practitioner Registration

Dear Stephen Conti and Members of the Board,

I agree to voluntarily surrender my registration to practice as a registered massage practitioner ("RMP") in the State of Maryland, registration number R02689, to the Maryland State Board of Massage Therapy Examiners (the "Board"). I understand that I may not practice as an RMP, with or without compensation, as it is defined in the Maryland Massage Therapy Act (the "Act"), Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. ("HO") § 6-101 *et seq.* and the Board's regulations, COMAR 10.65.01 *et seq.* In other words, as of the effective date of this Letter of Surrender, I understand that I am in the same position as an individual who is not registered to practice as an RMP. I understand that this Letter of Surrender shall become a **PUBLIC** document and shall become effective on the date of the Board's acceptance of this Letter of Surrender. I agree that this letter may be released or published by the Board as a final decision and order under the Public Information Act, Md. Code Ann., General Provisions §§ 4-101 *et seq.*

I acknowledge that I was originally registered to practice massage therapy in the State of Maryland on June 23, 2017, and that my registration expired on October 31, 2018. I acknowledge that the Board initiated an investigation of my registration after receiving a complaint from a health insurance company, stating that it received a reimbursement request for massage therapy I provided on December 15, 2022. I acknowledge that I did not notify the Board in writing within 60 days of my change in address. I acknowledge that the Board issued two *subpoenas duces tecum* to me, seeking client records, to which I did not respond. I acknowledge that I practiced massage therapy in the State of Maryland without a current license or registration from approximately 2019 to 2023.

I understand that, since more than five years have passed since my registration to practice as an RMP expired, the Board may not reinstate my registration to practice as an

RMP. I understand that, pursuant to the Act, on or after October 1, 2024, the Board may not issue an initial registration to practice as a registered massage practitioner. I understand that I may apply for a new license by meeting the licensing requirements in effect at the time of application for obtaining a new license under the Act and any additional requirements determined by the Board.

In executing this agreement to surrender my registration to practice as an RMP to the Board, I agree that if I decide to apply for licensure to practice massage therapy in Maryland, I will approach the Board in the same posture as an unlicensed individual whose registration has been revoked. In considering my application for licensure, the Board may review my entire Board file, including any information the Board receives after the execution of this letter. I understand that it will be my burden, as an applicant for licensure, to demonstrate that I meet all of the Board's requirements for licensure at the time I submit a licensure application.

I understand that if the Board issues a new license to practice massage therapy, it will be issued through the Board's disciplinary process and that my license will only be issued by the Board's issuance of a public order and that the Board may, in its discretion, place my license on probation subject to terms and conditions.

I acknowledge that upon the execution of this Letter of Surrender, I shall surrender to the Board any indicia of Maryland registration that is in my possession, including my Maryland registration to practice massage therapy, number R02689, and any wall certificate. I understand that the Board will advise the National Practitioner Data Bank of this Letter of Surrender, and in any response to an inquiry, that I have surrendered my registration in lieu of potential disciplinary action under the Act that the Board may institute. I also understand that in the event I should apply for licensure in any form in any other state or jurisdiction, this Letter of Surrender, and all underlying documents, may be released or published by the Board to the same extent as a final order that would result from disciplinary action pursuant to Md. Code Ann., General Prov. § § 4-101 *et seq.*


I wish to make it clear that I have voluntarily, knowingly, and freely chosen to submit this Letter of Surrender. I understand that, by executing this Letter of Surrender, I am waiving the right, now and in the future to any evidentiary hearing at which I would have the right to counsel, to confront witnesses, to give testimony, to call witnesses on my own behalf, to contest the facts summarized in the second paragraph of this Letter of Surrender and at which I would have the right to all other substantive and procedural protections provided by law, including the right to appeal.

I acknowledge that I may not rescind this Letter of Surrender in part or in its entirety for any reason whatsoever. I understand the nature and effect of both the Board's actions and this Letter of Surrender fully. Finally, I wish to make clear that I have had an
