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DENIAL OF MASSAGE THERAPY CERTIFICATE

BACKGROUND

On June 6, 2000 the Maryland State Board of Chiropractic Examiners (the "Board"), received information that Pola M. YU (the "Applicant") falsified information on her application for a massage therapy certificate. On June 6, 2000 the Board voted to initially deny the Applicant's application.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Applicant submitted an application for certification to practice massage therapy.
2. The aforementioned application asks an applicant to state whether or not he or she has pled guilty to or received probation before judgment for any criminal act. The Applicant answered no.
3. On August 7, 1998 the Applicant was found guilty of unauthorized use of a professional title.

CONCLUSIONS

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes, as a matter of law, that the Applicant violated the Act, Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. ("H.O.") §§ 3-5A-09 et seq., by making false statements on her application for a certificate to practice massage therapy.

ORDER

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is this _____ day of _____, 2000, by the Maryland State Board of Chiropractic Examiners hereby

ORDERED, that the application for certification of Pola M. Yu is hereby **DENIED**.

NOTICE OF RIGHT OF APPEAL
