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Recap: RFP #1 Services Only

- CHRC issued first Coordinated Community Supports RFP (services only) – August 18
- Applications were due October 18
- Grant period will be March 2024 June 2025
- \$120 million available



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Proposals received under first RFP

- 258 total eligible proposals requesting \$380,877,877.
- All eligible proposals had **letter of support** from local Superintendent or Superintendent's designee.
- At least one proposal was received from **every jurisdiction** of the state.

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Application review process - RFP #1 Services Only

All proposals evaluated by:

- 1. National Center for School Mental Health
- 2. Another member of the review committee

Each proposal scored on 100-point scale, according to criteria listed in RFP, to determine:

- Superior (85-100),
- Satisfactory (70-84), or
- Not Recommended (69 and below)



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RFP #1 Services only - Review Criteria

- 1. Responds to documented local need
- **4.** Integration and alignment with other programs
- **2.** Organizational capacity, cultural and linguistic competency
- **5.** Engagement with schools, families, and communities in the planning and execution of programming
- **3.** Program design, prospects for success, use of Evidence-Based Programs
- **6.** Ability to demonstrate measurable outcomes

Also consider:

- 1. Equity
- 3. Prioritization by LEA
- 2. Geographic balance
- 4. Age distribution pre-K-12



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December 12 Review Committee meeting recommendations

- No formula for distributing funds across jurisdictions under this RFP.
- Advance all Double Superior, Superior/ Satisfactory, and Double Satisfactory
- Do not advance any Double Not Recommended.
- To ensure equity and appropriate geographic distribution of grant funds, staff used public school enrollment and FARMs to develop wide estimated target funding ranges for each jurisdiction.
- These funding ranges were used to determine how many additional proposals to consider for each jurisdiction (below the Double Superior, Superior/Satisfactory, and Double Satisfactory ratings).

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Budget revisions

- All proposals needed adjustments to their budgets.
- Methodology applied consistently to all 123 proposals to develop revised top-line budget numbers.
- Revised top-line budgets were given to applicants with recommended areas for budget cuts.
- Applicants also were given questions based on reviewer comments and Consortium staff analysis.
- Applicants have resubmitted revised budgets that include reductions to meet the revised top-line number.
- Some requested further reductions.
- They also submitted responses to questions.



Examples of Budget revisions

- 1. Pro-rate for revised/updated grant period (March 2024 June 2025 instead of December 2023 June 20205)
- 2. Expenditures not permissible according to the RFP
- 3. Account for anticipated Medicaid revenues
- 4. Overly large or complex in scope implementation concerns
- 5. Excessive indirect costs



Of the \$136 million total requested by the 123 recommended proposals, budget revisions brought the total funding to approximately \$108 million.

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Consortium meeting on January 4, 2024

- The Consortium voted to adopt the 123 proposals recommended by the Review Committee, with budget adjustments by staff.
- The Consortium also recommended that up to 15 additional proposals advance.
- Following the vote, the Review Committee was instructed to reconvene to discuss (1) whether additional proposals should advance, and (2) if so, which proposals should advance. The Review Committee's recommendations should be presented directly to the CHRC.

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Review Committee meeting on January 11, 2024

- Do not advance the 15 additional applicants proposed at the Consortium meeting – use a different methodology.
- Do not advance any from Satisfactory/Not Recommended or Double Not Recommended.
- Consider only the remaining Superior/Not Recommended.
 32 proposals
- Among these 32, consider only composite scores above 140 (the threshold composite score for a Double Satisfactory would be 140).
 25 proposals
- Among these 25, consider geographic distribution – do not consider programs in jurisdictions that are funded above the target.
 6 additional proposals

129 total proposals recommended, total of \$111,080,000



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129 recommended proposals - snapshot

- At least one proposal from every jurisdiction of the state.
- Geographic balance and equity considered.
- On balance, proposals address all three tiers of Multi-Tiered System of Supports (1. universal/prevention, 2. small group/brief, 3. individual/ intensive.)
- On balance, proposals address all ages K-12, some proposals address pre-K.

- Most applicants have some existing relationship with school system.
- Most applicants will use one or more of the 15 Priority Evidence-Based Programs listed in RFP.
- 13 applicants have recommended proposals in more than one jurisdiction.
