Maryland Community Health Resources Commission
Grant Awards, 2026-2027 School Year

The Maryland General Assembly created the Maryland Consortium on Coordinated Community Supports as part of the Blueprint for Maryland's Future in recognition of the critical role that mental health and wraparound services play in supporting student achievement.

The Consortium is responsible for expanding access to comprehensive behavioral health services for Maryland students, pre-K through grade 12. As part of this mandate, the Consortium is funding new and expanded programming in all 24 jurisdictions; fostering collaboration between providers, schools, and families; and providing training and technical assistance in evidence-based approaches for clinicians and educators.

In its second year, the Consortium achieved a statewide impact, supporting programs in all 24 jurisdictions. Through the end of March 2026, the Consortium has:

- Initiated 154 programs
- Served 88% of Maryland's schools
- Served more than 176,000 children
- Hired more than 1,090 new behavioral health workforce members (across years 1 & 2)
- Trained an additional 5,961 school staff in behavioral health practices
- Achieved 90% satisfaction rate

Following is an overview of the programs that will be implemented in year three of the program, the 2026-2027 school year. The programs are projected to serve more than 200,000 students.

TRACK 1 – Community Supports Partnerships

The Blueprint requires the Consortium to form local "Community Supports Partnerships" across the state. Using the collective impact model, each Partnership consists of a local coordinating body called a "Hub," as well as the local community behavioral health providers. Hubs coordinate service providers in collaboration with schools. The fiscal year 2027 awards are supporting 14 Community Supports Partnerships covering 20 jurisdictions of the state.

Anne Arundel Anne Arundel Mental Health Agency, \$9,000,000.

Anne Arundel County Service Providers:

Anne Arundel County Community Action Agency. This grantee offers year-round behavioral health support for students and families through on-site services, family engagement, school collaboration, transportation assistance, community involvement, and a therapeutic summer camp in order to promote student well-being and academic success.

Anne Arundel County Department of Health. This grantee offers services to students and families to remain drug free and fulfill their potential in school and life. They offer a bilingual 10-week Strengthening Families Program (SFP), as well as peer-to-peer education through the Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD) clubs.

Anne Arundel County Mental Health Agency. This grantee offers Mental Health Stabilization Services to support youth and family in maintaining their current placement and diverting youth from higher intensity services such as in-patient care and residential interventions.

Anne Arundel County Partnership for Children, Youth and Families. This grantee offers navigation to services and resources for students and families using a three-generation lens.

Arundel Lodge. This grantee offers walk-in access to mental and behavioral health services, no appointment required. Services include but are not limited to behavioral health risk screenings, assessments, brief interventions, crisis stabilization, safety planning, transitional brief treatment, and community care navigation.

Change the Conversation. This grantee offers Turn the Talk, an evidence-informed program that equips adolescents to understand, identify, and report child sexual abuse and minor sex trafficking, while promoting awareness of laws, effects, resources, and advocacy.

EveryMind, Inc. This grantee offers mental health literacy, education and prevention programming to caregivers, students and the community in English and Spanish.

Innovative Therapeutic Services. This grantee offers outpatient therapy for individuals, groups, and family, psychiatric rehabilitation program (PRP) services, and after-school therapy services, as well as mental health education, consultation, family support, and therapeutic mentoring.

Maryland Coalition of Families. This grantee offers family peer support to parents and caregivers who have a child with a behavioral health challenge including emotional support, resource connection, systems navigation, support groups, and educational workshops from specialists who have lived experience caring for their own child.

Playworks. This grantee offers services to promote healthy play during recess.

Restoration Community Development Corporation. This grantee offers engagement, health and wellness services for adolescent youth and families impacted by substance abuse disorders, environmental challenges, mental health, and academics.

The Children's Guild. This grantee offers diagnostic clinical assessments and ongoing counseling for individuals, family, and groups, as well as support for students who have truancy difficulties or a history of school suspensions.

Thrive Behavioral Health. This grantee offers psychotherapy, medication management, access to non-reimbursable services, as well as short-term early childhood behavioral interventions at school and home, counseling for middle and high school students using substances, and school-wide preventative strategies.

Villa Maria Behavioral Health / Catholic Charities. This grantee offers family care coordination to address student and family barriers related to disengagement and school attendance.

Baltimore County Department of Health, Bureau of Behavioral Health, \$10,000,000.

Baltimore County Service Providers:

Associated Catholic Charities. This grantee offers outreach to chronically absent and disengaged students and their families using a motivational interviewing approach. Care coordination is provided to link students and their families to services that address barriers related to school attendance.

Backpack Healthcare. This grantee offers in-person and virtual therapy and psychiatry services, caregiver wellness workshops, educator workshops, educator evidence-based training in culturally intentional care, and a self-care app.

BrainFutures. This grantee offers computer-based training and physical exercises to improve executive cognitive functioning.

BTST Services LLC. This grantee offers behavioral health screening, individual, group, and family therapy, crisis response, care coordination, parent/family education, and medication management. Services are offered in school, virtually, or in the community.

Change the Conversation. This grantee offers Turn the Talk, an evidence-informed program designed to reduce risk, strengthen protective factors, and connect students and families to coordinated supports. In addition, this grantee provides training for caregivers and educators to strengthen their ability to recognize, respond to, and appropriately address sensitive disclosures and behavioral health concerns.

Hazel Health, Inc. This grantee offers evidence-based virtual therapy for students, along with crisis response, care coordination, and parent/family education. Licensed therapists support kids K-12 with issues like anxiety, depression, and stress, helping improve wellbeing, behavior, and school attendance.

Hope Health Systems, Inc. This grantee offers a full continuum of services, including screening, assessment, and diagnosis; individual, group, and family therapy; prevention and social-emotional learning groups; crisis intervention and stabilization through the Early Intensive Intervention Program (EIP); psychiatry and medication management; care coordination and navigation; family engagement outreach and consultation for school staff.

Jewish Community Services. This grantee offers an array of services to support students' mental well-being, reduce risk factors for behavioral health challenges, and address barriers to school attendance. The services include therapy for individuals, groups and families including specialized play therapy, therapeutic mentoring and classroom-based programs that enhance social-emotional learning, foster positive coping strategies, and promote healthy decision making.

Lighthouse, Inc. This grantee offers individual, group and family counseling, as well as parenting education. Counselors collaborate with school personnel and other healthcare providers to develop comprehensive solutions for mental health needs, family relationships, and academic and behavioral concerns. Groups are offered periodically on specific topics such as anxiety, neurodivergence, and grief.

Thrive Behavioral Health. This grantee offers early/extended childhood behavioral intervention (ECBI), and substance use prevention and intervention (SUPI) services. Additionally, this grantee provides expanded services, including collaboration, consultation, access to copayment and uninsured payment support.

Tidemark Intervention Services. This grantee offers therapy, medication management, prevention programming, and psychiatric rehabilitation services through a comprehensive, evidence-based continuum of care to support and provide accessible, high-quality mental health care that promotes wellness, resilience, and stability through school-based therapy services.

TurnAround, Inc. This grantee offers therapy, case management, individual therapy, group therapy, and crisis intervention and advocacy services to youth who have or are experiencing dating/sexual violence, as well as educational workshops and information sessions in coordination with the school district.

Behavioral Health System Baltimore, Inc. \$10,000,000. Partnership serves Baltimore City.

Baltimore City Service Providers:

Boys & Girls Clubs of Metropolitan Baltimore. This grantee offers Positive Action social emotional learning curriculum to help youth identify and understand their emotions and make positive choices in responding to those emotions.

BTST Services LLC. This grantee offers individual and family therapy, family engagement support teacher consultation, training support, and professional development, and behavioral health screenings. Additionally, medication management, case management services and behavioral health coordination are available to support the family inside and outside of the school.

Building Blocks Health Care Network. This grantee offers school-based therapy and family support to help students manage stress, express emotions in healthy ways, and build skills for success in school and life. The program connects families with helpful resources, and ensures students have support at home, in school, and in the community.

Change the Conversation. This grantee offers Turn the Talk, an evidence-informed program that equips adolescents to understand, identify, and report child sexual abuse and minor sex trafficking, while promoting awareness of laws, effects, resources, and advocacy.

Hazel Health, Inc. This grantee offers free, evidence-based virtual therapy for students, along with crisis response, care coordination, and parent/family education. Licensed therapists support kids K-12 with issues like anxiety, depression, and stress, helping improve wellbeing, behavior, and school attendance.

Johns Hopkins University Rales Health Center. This grantee offers the Youth Aware of Mental Health program for full grade-levels in middle schools and for selected groups of higher-risk high school students. The grantee provides universal depression screening, and assessment, treatment, and referral for mental health conditions.

Johns Hopkins University SMART Program for Suicide Prevention. This grantee offers suicide prevention training for students, staff and parents in English and Spanish; helps identify students at risk; provides consultation and triage services staffed by a pediatric psychiatrist during mental health crises; and helps connect students to mental health services in and outside of the school with the assistance of a community health worker.

Keys Development. This grantee offers services to students ages 5 and older who have been diagnosed with a mental health disorder and substance use disorder and who have medical insurance through Medicaid.

Sarah's House Mental Health Services, LLC. This grantee offers family supports including B-PACT (Baltimore Parents Are Community Teachers); the adapted Families in the Driver's Seat curriculum, Family Check-Up, Mental Health First Aid Training for Parent-Leaders, and the development of a Parent Drop-In Care Center.

Sheppard Pratt Health System, Inc. This grantee offers individual, group, and family therapy. Students receiving services also qualify for case management, trauma informed care, suicide prevention, crisis

stabilization and response, behavioral health education, care navigation, support groups, psychiatric care, and medication management.

The United Way of Central Maryland, Inc. This grantee offers expanded behavioral health and wraparound services for teen parents. Services include needs assessment and screening, parenting coaching using Circle of Security program, small group and family counseling, home visits, and resource navigation.

The Y in Central Maryland. This grantee offers a comprehensive approach to support student well-being and academic success through Youth Aware of Mental Health, Student Check-Up, Cognitive Behavioral Intervention for Trauma in Schools, Success Mentoring, and Wellness Sessions. These services target truancy, academic underperformance, lack of mentorship, and wellness related challenges.

T.I.M.E. Organization. This grantee offers mental health and coordination services to students and families, helping students manage emotional challenges, stress, anxiety, and grief. The grantee supports early learning in pre-K and kindergarten classrooms and leads classroom activities for all grade level students focused on building healthy friendships and learning to resolve problems together.

Transformation Health, LLC. This grantee offers comprehensive, trauma-informed behavioral health services that support the whole child and family through prevention, early intervention, treatment, and recovery.

TurnAround, Inc. This grantee offers individual therapy, group therapy, and crisis intervention and advocacy services to youth who have or are experiencing dating/sexual violence, as well as educational workshops and information sessions in coordination with the school district.

University of Maryland School of Medicine. This grantee offers school mental health promotion, prevention, and intervention supports and services for youth and families, with a strong focus on school-family-community partnerships, as well as school-wide prevention programming, parent and caregiver education (delivered at school sites in partnership with community-based organizations), and brief treatment services.

Carroll County Government Local Management Board, \$2,500,000.

Carroll County Service Providers:

Advanced Behavioral Health, Inc. This grantee offers evidence-based mental health care, therapy, and mentoring for youth and adults, including the Carroll County Stand Tall and Remain in School (CC-STARS) program to address school refusal and outpatient psychiatric services across Maryland.

Carroll County Youth Service Bureau. This grantee offers individualized support for students and families through in-home and family-based services designed to strengthen relationships, improve communication, and build skills to navigate challenges. Services help families create stability, develop healthy coping strategies, and connect to supports that promote long-term success.**Sheppard Pratt Health System, Inc.** This grantee offers individual, group, and family therapy. Students receiving services also qualify for case management, trauma informed care, suicide prevention, crisis stabilization and response, behavioral health education, care navigation, support groups, psychiatric care, and medication management.

Cecil County Health Department, \$2,500,000.

Cecil County Service Providers:

Cecil County, Maryland, Local Management Board. This grantee offers family navigation, referral assistance, and community partnerships to ensure families can access the programs and supports they need to promote healthy development and well-being.

The Cook Center for Human Connection. This grantee offers parent coaching, school staff training, and promotes positive classroom environments.

LIVEFORTHOMAS Foundation. This grantee offers suicide awareness and prevention services, peer-to-peer support, and support groups. Programming includes Hope Squad and Hope Squad Jr., Mental Health Awareness talks, the Family Check-Up program, and Den 22.

Thrive Behavioral Health. This grantee offers early/extended childhood behavioral intervention (ECBI) and access to expanded services, including collaboration, consultation, access to copayment, and uninsured payment support.

Youth Empowerment Source. This grantee offers parenting education, social-emotional learning, conflict resolution, and wellness-focused programs that help build confidence, healthy relationships, and lifelong skills for success.

Frederick County Local Behavioral Health Authority, \$5,000,000.

Frederick County Service Providers:

Advanced Behavioral Health, Inc. This grantee offers evidence-based mental health care, therapy, and youth mentoring through the Frederick County Stand Tall and Remain in School (FC-STARS) program to address school refusal, along with outpatient mental health and psychiatric services, bilingual supports, and therapeutic mentoring for children, adults, and families.

Asian American Center of Frederick. This grantee offers healthcare access, early childhood and parent education, family support, workforce training, citizenship and language services, and emergency financial aid—helping immigrant and minority families build stability, confidence, and brighter futures in Maryland.

Associated Catholic Charities, Inc. This grantee offers wraparound care coordination services to intervene with disengaged students by addressing student and family barriers related to school attendance.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Frederick County. This grantee offers social-emotional skill building and character development through after-school activities.

Center for Anxiety and Behavioral Change. This grantee offers evidence-based treatment for anxiety, OCD, trauma, and related disorders, including individual, group, and family therapy, with a focus on students with chronic absenteeism.

Centro Hispano de Frederick. This grantee offers the Éxito Wellness Program, which supports Hispanic students' STEAM learning and social-emotional well-being during the school year, and provides countywide summer programs for students in grades 2–12.

Heartly House. This grantee offers abuse and violence prevention education, case management services, and counseling services for children and parents.

Mental Health Association of Frederick County, Inc. This grantee offers parent coaching and systems navigation services to address and prevent school avoidance, increase parental support, and provide connection to community resources.

Parent Encouragement Program (PEP). This grantee offers a free 8-week program for FCPS parents and caregivers to support your child's mental wellness, resiliency, and success in school.

Sheppard Pratt Health System, Inc. This grantee offers individual, group, and family therapy. Students receiving services also qualify for case management, trauma informed care, suicide prevention, crisis stabilization and response, behavioral health education, care navigation, support groups, psychiatric care, and medication management.

Student Homelessness Initiative Partnership (SHIP) of Frederick County. This grantee offers care management services for youth experiencing homelessness.

The Frederick Center. This grantee offers support for LGBTQ+ individuals and their families through peer support groups, advocacy, community events, resource directories, and a safe, affirming community space.

The Lourie Center for Children's Social & Emotional Wellness. This grantee offers programs that enhance the social and emotional well-being of young children and their families through prevention, early intervention, education, research, and training.

Garrett County Health Department, \$2,500,000. Partnership serves Garrett and Allegany Counties.

Allegany County Service Providers:

Allegany College of MD. This grantee offers Mind Body Medicine services, providing education about the fundamentals of the brain and nervous system, stress and stress reduction, emotion regulation, and overall emotional health and well-being. Skills are taught in classroom and small group settings.

Allegany County Health Department Outpatient Behavioral Health Services. This grantee offers in-school counseling and support for students and their families dealing with substance use challenges, including vaping. These services focus on supporting students' emotional well-being and continue through the summer months, with free transportation available to help students attend appointments.

Maryland Coalition of Families. This grantee offers family peer support to parents and caregivers who have a child with a behavioral health challenge including emotional support, resource connection, systems navigation, support groups, and educational workshops from specialists who have lived experience caring for their own child.

Mountain Laurel Medical Center. This grantee offers individual and group counseling for mild and moderate behavioral health challenges, interim crisis stabilization and de-escalation, intensive individual therapy for behavioral and mental health needs, behavioral health care coordination, and crisis response coordination with Baltimore Crisis Response, Inc.

Garrett County Service Providers:

Allegany College of MD. This grantee offers Mind Body Medicine services, providing education about the fundamentals of the brain and nervous system, stress and stress reduction, emotion regulation, and overall emotional health and well-being. Skills are taught in classroom and small group settings.

The Center for Behavioral Health. This grantee offers individual, group, and family therapy; medication management; wrap-around services involving meetings and consultations with school staff, families and involved community agencies, and works with Health Education & Outreach to provide behavioral health awareness groups at Partners After School locations.

Health Education and Outreach. This grantee offers after school programs for all youth in grades 3 to 5, in addition to a bullying prevention initiative that uses the Second Step curriculum.

Mountain Laurel Medical Center. This grantee offers individual and group counseling for mild and moderate behavioral health challenges, interim crisis stabilization and de-escalation, intensive individual therapy for behavioral and mental health needs, behavioral health care coordination, and crisis response coordination with Baltimore Crisis Response, Inc. (BCRI) for immediate interventions.

Harford County Office on Mental Health, \$4,000,000.

Harford County Service Providers:

Ashley Treatment Center. This grantee offers comprehensive substance use disorder prevention and education services, supporting individuals and families through the evidence-based practice of peer support.

Care Solace. This grantee offers free, confidential, 24/7 care coordination to help students, staff, and families quickly connect with mental health or substance use providers in any language.

Change the Conversation. This grantee offers Turn the Talk, an evidence-informed program that equips adolescents to understand, identify, and report child sexual abuse and minor sex trafficking, while promoting awareness of laws, effects, resources, and advocacy.

Cook Center for Human Connection. This grantee offers services and resources to support parents, caregivers, and families including Parent Cognitive Behavioral Coaching, Parentguidance.org courses, and Mental Health Series events.

Fresh Start Therapeutic Services. This grantee offers individual, family and group therapy; as well as therapeutic mentoring and community group support on topics such as depression, anxiety, coping skills, social skills, independent living skills, suicide and substance use prevention.

LASOS, Inc (Linking All So Others Succeed). This grantee offers community-based programs supporting at-risk youth and families with prevention, intervention, and diversion services to address behavioral, mental health, substance use, and academic challenges.

Nature Worx. This grantee offers mindfulness-based nature immersion sessions for students and their families to help participants learn skills to support their mental/emotional health and increase their resiliency/coping abilities.

Thrive Behavioral Health. This grantee offers Early Childhood Behavioral Intervention, Student Support services, and expanded access to services/non-insurance reimbursable services (consultation/IEP meetings, translation, and uninsured/underinsured funding).

Howard County Office of the Local Children's Board, \$7,000,000.

Howard County Service Providers:

AprilMay Company, Inc (AMCI). This grantee offers comprehensive early childhood behavioral health

services that support children ages 3-5 through developmentally responsive, family-centered care. In addition, we provide family-centered mental health and wraparound services to help families navigate resources to promote stability and well-being.

Backpack Healthcare. This grantee offers in-person Substance Use Disorder and life skills groups and peer support services in Howard County schools, virtual caregiver workshops, and virtual and in-person therapy and psychiatry services across the county for students and their families.

Congruent Counseling Services. This grantee offers outpatient mental health therapy, substance health assessment, counseling and groups, family consultation, and family counseling.

Maryland Coalition of Families. This grantee offers family peer support to parents and caregivers who have a child with mental health challenges in pre-K, Head Start, and kindergarten through 12th grade.

Sheppard Pratt. This grantee offers individual, group, and family therapy. Students receiving services also qualify for case management, trauma informed care, suicide prevention, crisis stabilization and response, behavioral health education, care navigation, support groups, psychiatric care, and medication management.

Thrive Behavioral Health. This grantee offers psychotherapy, medication management, access to non-reimbursable services (consultation, translation, IEP meetings, and funding for uninsured/underinsured), short-term early childhood behavioral interventions at school and home, counseling for middle and high school students using substances, and school-wide preventative strategies.

T.I.M.E. Organization. This grantee offers in-school therapy and psychiatric services, care coordination and navigation, bilingual support for Latinx newcomers, professional development for teachers, parent/caregiver workshops and support services, and a therapeutic summer camp.

Mid Shore Behavioral Health, \$5,200,000. Partnership serves Caroline, Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, and Talbot Counties.

Caroline County Service Providers:

Caroline County Health Department-Behavioral Health. This grantee offers behavioral health education, individual therapy, substance use services, transportation vouchers, peer services, case management, and family supports.

Choptank Community Health. This grantee offers co-occurring individual therapy, care coordination, substance use prevention, suicide prevention, family groups, and family support delivered through school-based health centers.

Cook Center for Human Connection. This grantee offers parent, caregiver and staff support through the Mental Health Series Platform, Parent Cognitive Behavioral Coaching, & Staff Cognitive Behavioral Coaching.

The Affiliated Sante Group. This grantee offers mobile crisis response, comprehensive crisis assessment, short-term stabilization, family-centered skill building, care coordination, school collaboration, and warm handoffs to longer-term community-based services.

Dorchester County Service Providers:

Cook Center for Human Connection. This grantee offers parent and caregiver support through the Mental Health Series Platform & Parent Cognitive Behavioral Coaching.

Creative Space Child Therapy. This grantee offers school-based play therapy and child therapy services, parent coaching, and therapeutic camp activities.

Dorchester County Health Department. This grantee offers mental health treatment and/or psychoeducational skill building groups, along with support for parents/caregivers.

Harvesting Hope Youth and Family Wellness. This grantee offers strengths-based care including individual, group, and family therapy.

Mental Health Association of Maryland. The grantee offers community mental health education and outreach, including Teen Mental Health First Aid for high school students and Youth Mental Health First Aid for community members.

Parent Encouragement Program. This grantee offers small group family resiliency programs for parents and primary caregivers of children ages 2 to 18. The 8-week program can be in-person or virtual and is offered in English and Spanish.

Kent County Service Providers:

Boys and Girls Clubs of Harford & Cecil Counties. This grantee offers social-emotional skill building and character development through after-school activities.

Choptank Community Health System. This grantee offers co-occurring individual therapy, care coordination, substance use prevention, suicide prevention, family groups, and family support delivered through school-based health centers (SBHCs).

For All Seasons. This grantee offers individual and family therapy, telehealth, support groups, psychiatric care, mindfulness, and mental health literacy programs. Bilingual services are also available.

Queen Anne's County Service Providers:

Chesapeake Bay Psychological Services. This grantee offers outpatient behavioral health services, psychotherapy, and substance use disorder assessment/treatment.

Choptank Community Health System. This grantee offers co-occurring individual therapy, care coordination, substance use prevention, suicide prevention, family groups, and family support, delivered through the applicant's school-based health centers (SBHCs).

Hazel Health, Inc. This grantee offers individual teletherapy sessions, behavioral health assessments, crisis consultations for school staff, family engagement, and care coordination.

Striving for Wellness Together. This grantee offers school-wide preventative and mental health services; individual, group and family counseling; and behavioral health education, support, and navigation for families.

Thrive Behavioral Health. This grantee offers family education and support, school staff training, and expanded access to services/non-insurance reimbursable services (consultation/IEP meetings, translation, and uninsured/underinsured funding).

Talbot County Service Providers:

The Cook Center for Human Connection. This grantee offers parent and caregiver support through the Mental Health Series Platform & Parent Cognitive Behavioral Coaching.

Parent Encouragement Program. This grantee offers small group family resiliency programs for parents and primary caregivers of children ages 2 to 18. The 8-week program can be in-person or virtual and is offered in English and Spanish.

Peace of Mind Mental Health Services. This grantee offers individual, group, and family counseling; parenting workshops; small groups in a school setting to address specific mental health needs; and access to psychiatric prescribers.

Montgomery County Maryland Government, \$12,000,000.

Montgomery County Service Providers:

Advanced Behavioral Health. This grantee offers access to therapy for under- and uninsured students. The funding can cover co-pays, deductibles, or provide services to uninsured students.

AprilMay Company. This grantee offers personalized support for behavioral, emotional, social, and learning challenges that may affect their success in the classroom. The grantee works closely with students, families, and school staff to build skills, strengthen confidence, improve school experiences.

CaringMatters. This grantee offers peer support groups for grieving students. Caregivers are given linguistically appropriate information on how they can support their children.

Change the Conversation. This grantee offers Turn the Talk, an evidence-informed program that equips adolescents to understand, identify, and report child sexual abuse and minor sex trafficking, while promoting awareness of laws, effects, resources, and advocacy.

Conflict Resolution Center of Montgomery County. This grantee offers services to navigate conflicts, improve communication, and address attendance challenges. Through supportive conversations, restorative approaches, and one-on-one guidance, the grantee helps students and families build problem-solving skills, strengthen relationships, resolve conflicts peacefully, and stay connected to school at no cost to families.

EveryMind. This grantee offers prevention, early intervention, and continuity of care across the school community, including students, caregivers, school staff, and educators.

Identity, Inc. This grantee offers emotional support groups, life skills training, substance abuse prevention, and trauma awareness. It serves High School populations of Latino, low-income, and Emergent Multilingual Learner students.

Innovative Therapeutic Services. This grantee offers services to help students develop social, emotional, and problem-solving skills that support success in school and everyday life.
