# Consortium Subcommittees

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## Framework, Design, & RFP

- Develops statewide framework to establish community support partnerships
- Issues recommendations that will inform future Call for Proposals issued by the Community Health Resources Commission.

## Data Collection/Analysis & Program Evaluation

- Evaluate current available data to establish baseline for impact of Consortium and community support partnerships.

## Outreach and Community Engagement

- Engage stakeholders to make them aware of funding opportunity.

## Best Practices

- Offer recommendations and best practices for community partnerships to provide behavioral health and wraparound services.

# Consortium Duties & Subcommittee Assignment

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1. Coordinate with AIB and others to measure impact. (Data)
2. Develop framework for creation of partnerships. (Framework)
3. Ensure Supports are provided in holistic and coordinated manner. (Framework)
4. Expand available supports to all students in a school system. (Framework)
5. Implement grant program to deliver supports. (Framework)
6. Evaluate a provider reimbursement system. (Framework)
7. Ensure access to services within a 1-hour drive. (Framework)
8. Implement best practices for positive classroom experience (Best Practices)
9. Assist in the creation of best practices. (Best Practices)

# Potential Questions for Subcommittee & Stakeholder Consideration

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## Framework, Design & RFP Subcommittee

- What types of behavioral health and wraparound services should be prioritized for funding in the first round of grants?
- How should the program be structured in order to direct funding where it is most needed, while not placing well-performing jurisdictions at a disadvantage to receive funding?
- How should the program address shortages in the behavioral health workforce?
- If the grant funding is to be awarded competitively, what should the review criteria be?

# Potential Questions for Subcommittee & Stakeholder Consideration

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## Data Analysis & Program Evaluation

- What relevant baseline data is currently available to measure the impact of the Consortium?
- Which data should grantees be responsible to measure and report?
- How could improvements/impact at the *individual* student level be measured?
