FRONT DESKTRIAGE—REACTIVE

Key Recommendations

- Complete Screening Questions listed below
- Reschedule non-essential appointments
- Recommend televisit appointments for sick visits if available and appropriate

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, social distancing means:

- Remaining out of "congregate settings" as much as possible
- Avoiding mass gatherings
- Maintaining distance of approximately 6 feet (2 meters) from others when possible

Screening Questions

Step I: Symptom Screen (If possible, complete prior to patient entering practice for in-office visit)

Does the patient report of any of the following? (Symptoms of respiratory infection)

- 1. Fever (Fever may be subjective or confirmed)
- 2. Cough, shortness of breath
- 3. Sore throat with runny nose
- 4. If yes, provide the patient with a facemask

Step 2: Procedure for Patient in Office

- A. Educate on hand hygiene, cough etiquette, and social distancing.
- B. Advise patient of locations of tissues and alcohol based hand sanitizers within practice.
- C. Maintain distancing for 6 feet while escorting patient with possible COVID-19 infection to the designated room* at your practice. Keep the door closed.
- D. Immediately contact the designated person for triage.

*Notes:

- Identify a separate, well-ventilated space that allows waiting patients to be separated by 6 or more feet, with easy access to respiratory hygiene supplies. If possible, room patients in an exam room that includes a private bathroom. If space is an issue, patients might opt to wait in a personal vehicle or outside the practice where they can be contacted by mobile phone when it is their turn to be evaluated.
- Designated staff interacting with suspected COVID-19 patient within exam room should wear PPE: Respirator (if not available, facemask) and goggles, gown, and gloves per <u>CDC recommendations</u>. Perform hand washing before and after contact.
