MDPCP Requirements – Comprehensiveness & Coordination

Track One

- Coordinate referrals with high volume/cost specialists serving population
- Integrate behavioral health

Track Two (all of the above, plus)

• Facilitate access to community resources and supports for social needs





MDPCP Requirements-Social Needs

- Track 2 Practices are required to:
- Complete an assessment of their attributed beneficiaries' health-related social needs
 - Use a validated screening tool like <u>AHC CMS Accountable Health</u> <u>Communities (AHC) Health-Related Social Needs (HRSN)</u>
- Conduct an inventory of resources and supports in the community to meet those needs
 - Implement a workflow to link patients to local resources
- ❖Track 1 Practices also encouraged to implement screening and referrals
 - Screening process should be in place for Track 2 Transition






Screening Tools

 - 10-question
- American Academy of Family Physicians tool
 - The short-form(bit.ly) includes 11 questions
- PRAPARE Toolkit, Chapter 9:
 - The National Association of Community Health Centers' <u>Protocol for Responding to and Assessing Patients' Assets, Risks, and Experiences tool(www.nachc.org)</u>
 - (PRAPARE) includes 15 core questions and 5 supplemental questions





eReferral: Workflow – Screening and Referral Integrated into CRISP




Practices

- Outbound: e-referral completed in CRISP HIE tab
- **Inbound**: Clinical provider is notified of enrollments and status by partner programs

Non-clinical Partner Orgs

- **Inbound**: Receives a secure email with the referral request
- Outbound: On a monthly basis, entry of patient/client outreach as Care Alert into CRISP for Practice to view

Support for Patients at Home

- **❖** Food
 - Meals on Wheels
- Caregivers
 - Visiting nurses and caregivers
- Emotional support
 - Support from family
 - Phone calls and video chat to fight loneliness
 - MD Department of Aging Senior Call Check Program



Caregiver Services Corps (CSC)



- ❖ The **CSC** call center (**800-337-8958**), staffed with specialists 7 days a week, matches volunteers to senior citizens in their homes to help with:
 - > Individuals' self-administration of medications
 - ➤ Ambulation and transferring
 - ➤ Bathing and completing personal hygiene routines
 - ➤ Meal preparation and arranging for delivery of groceries and/or prepared meals
 - > Teaching how to use video technologies to connect with loved ones and/or healthcare providers
- ❖ Healthcare providers should alert their patients that they are being referred
- Seniors, their families and friends may call 211 to seek help and referrals to the elderly in need
- * The CSC is functioning now in 8 counties on the Eastern Shore (all but Cecil)



Food Resources

❖ Nutrition: Inform patients that children can receive three free meals/day at sites listed on:


