

Terms

- 2 pages
- Defines and confirms relationship based on practice Option selection
 - Effective Jan 1
 - Renews Annually Unless Terminated
 - Care Management Fee Split
 - Lead Care Manager
 - Data Sharing
 - Termination & Notification

- Details the services & staff offered by the CTO to all partner practices based on Option and Track
- Practices initial beside services they want to select

Appendix B

- Business Associate Agreement (BAA)
- Allows the CTO to have access via CRISP to quality and utilization reports available to the Practice
- Practice is the Covered Entity; CTO is the Business Associate
- May be originated by either Practice or CTO



Practice Vetting in Progress

- Participation contingent on vetting and document submission:
 - 1. Vetting
 - Program integrity screening
 - Attribution
 - Minimum 125 Medicare FFS beneficiaries
 - Primary Care Taxonomy
 - Completion of vetting expected early Dec
 - 2. Document Submission by December 21

- 3. CRISP will aggregate the quality measure submissions from participating practices to submit to CMS.



Claims-Based Reports


CRISP will provide standard reports to each participating practice location and their CTO (as applicable). These will be created by CRISP's partner hMetrix based on Medicare claims data.

- ED visit rates for your practice
- Hospital admission rates for your practice
- Specialty referral patterns from your practice

These reports will rely on CMS attribution files to link Medicare beneficiaries with a practice location, and files to link practice locations with CTOs.




Early Wireframe: Summary View






Early Wireframe: Year-Over-Year Comparisons






Early Wireframe: Benchmarking






Early Wireframe: Trends






Early Wireframe: Drilldown by Payments






Early Wireframe: Payment Band






Early Wireframe: Professional Services Filters






Early Wireframe: Patient Details by Physician
