

Program Year 6 Snapshot - 2024

The Maryland Primary Care Program (MDPCP) is now in its sixth program year. The MDPCP is a voluntary program open to all qualifying Maryland primary care providers that provides funding and support for the delivery of advanced primary care throughout the state. The MDPCP supports the overall health care transformation process and allows primary care providers to play an increased role in prevention, management of chronic disease, and preventing unnecessary hospital utilization.

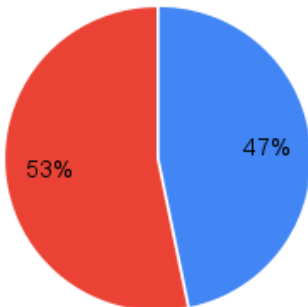

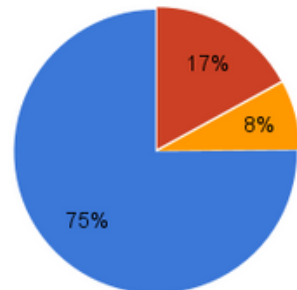

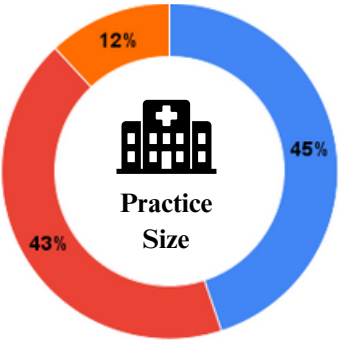

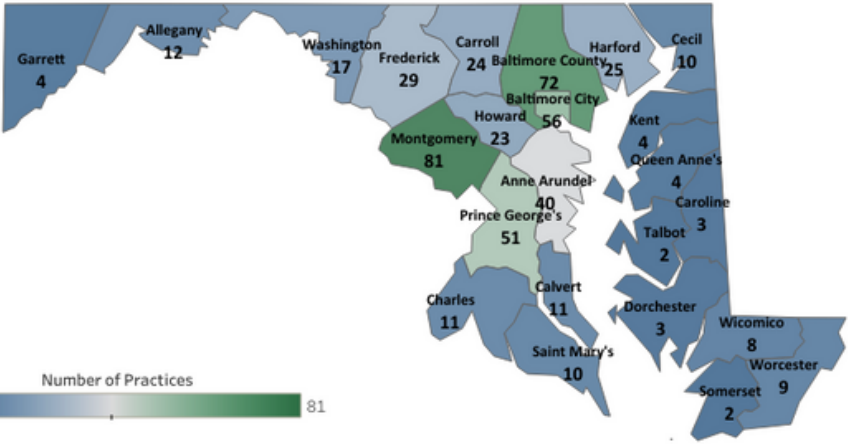
