<p>Maryland Area Health Education Center Program - AHEC Scholars Program</p>	<p>AHEC Scholars is a program geared towards health profession students. The AHEC Scholars Program (ASP) is a longitudinal program that provides students with interdisciplinary didactic and community-based clinical training in rural and/or underserved areas of the State.</p> <p>Educational training activities focus on six core topics: Interprofessional Education, Behavioral Health Integration, Social Determinants of Health, Cultural Competency, Practice Transformation, Current and Health Emerging Health Issues (e.g. COVID-19).</p> <p>At least forty-five (45) Scholars will enroll annually in the ASP, with fifteen (15) assigned to each center AHEC West, Central Maryland AHEC, and Eastern Shore AHEC.</p>	<p>If you have any questions, please contact Allison Robinson, MPH, arobinson@som.umaryland.edu.</p>
<p>AHEC - Primary Care Track</p>	<p>Medical students work alongside preceptors one half day per month during their pre-clinical years, and 80 hours in their first year summer with a primary care physician (PCP) mentor, through a collaboration with one of the three state AHECs. Along with these experiences with community physicians, students participate in monthly didactic sessions.</p> <p>Approximately 30% of the first, second and third year class are enrolled in this program. J-1 Visa Waiver Program	<p>The Maryland Office of Workforce Development reviews applications and makes recommendations to the U.S. Department of State for foreign-born physicians requesting waivers from their J-1 Visa. HHS Exchange Visitor Program	<p>The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is responsible for managing the U.S. Exchange Visitor Program as it relates to health research and clinical care. This program accepts applications to request waiver of the 2-year foreign residency requirement related to health care services needed in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) in the United States. Physicians with J-1 visas must agree to deliver health care services for three years in a mental health or primary care HPSA.</p>

Janet L Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program	<p>Open to Maryland residents who provide public service in Maryland State or local government or nonprofit agencies in Maryland to low income or underserved residents. Maryland Loan Repayment Program or State Loan Repayment Program	<p>MLARP (State Funds) applies to physicians, physician assistants, and medical residents in their last year of residency. Those eligible receive an opportunity to practice in a designated Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) while also getting funds to help pay their higher education loans.</p> <p>An eligible practice site is one operated as a public clinic by any federal, state, local governmental entity or a non-profit medical care facility that 1) treats all persons regardless of ability to pay, and 2) is located in a geographic region of Maryland that the Health Resources and Services Administration has designated as a HPSA (Primary Care HPSA for internal medicine, family medicine, pediatrics, obstetrics/gynecology and geriatrics; Mental HPSA for psychiatry). <p>National Health Service Corps Loan Programs</p>	<p>NHSC awardees commit to serving at approved sites to have their educational loans paid off. An NHSC-approved site is an organization that provides complete outpatient services to people living in Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs) and meets NHSC site eligibility requirements and qualifications as are specified on the website. <p>Nurse Corps</p>	<p>Nurse Corps awards scholarships and loan repayment to nurses, nursing students, and nurse faculty.</p> <p>In exchange, accepted applicants work at least two years in a Critical Shortage Facility (CSF). Or, they serve as nurse faculty (NF) in an eligible school of nursing.</p> <p>An eligible school of nursing includes hospitals, clinics, and other facilities with a lack of nurses.</p>	<p>See the website for further details.</p>
<p>Bonus and Tax Credit Programs</p>		
<p>CMS - Physician Bonuses</p>	<p>The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) pays a 10 percent bonus to physicians when you deliver Medicare-covered primary care or mental health services to patients in a geographic HPSA. CMS pays the bonus quarterly based on the amount paid for professional services.</p> <p>When you deliver services to Medicare patients in areas designated as primary care or mental health geographic HPSAs by HRSA as of December 31 of the prior year, you are eligible for the Medicare</p>	<p>Physicians should direct questions as to why a particular location is designated as a shortage area to the Maryland PCO Director, elizabeth.vaidya@maryland.gov. 	<p>HPSA bonus during the current year.</p> <p>If an area does not have a geographic primary care HPSA designation but has a geographic mental health HPSA designation, only psychiatrists who deliver services to Medicare patients in the designated area are eligible for the 10 percent bonus.</p>	
<p>Tax Preceptor Program</p>	<p>This Program authorizes a credit against the State income tax for individuals who have served as a preceptor in certain preceptorship programs and work in certain areas of the State with a health care workforce shortage. <p>Role of the Maryland Primary Care Office</p>	<p>The Primary Care Office (PCO) is federally funded to improve access to health services (primary care, mental health, and dental care) for Maryland residents. The PCO uses data to analyze the state for federal shortage designation (HPSAs, MUAs, and MUPs) to garner federal and state provider resources for underserved communities and populations.
