American Rescue Plan Act

Background

- President Biden signed ARPA into law March 11, 2021.
- § 9817 provides additional support for Medicaid home and community-based services (HCBS) during the COVID-19 emergency by providing a 10% enhanced federal medical assistance percentage (eFMAP) for a one year period from April 1, 2021-March 31, 2022.
- States must use the extra funds drawn down during this 1 year period by March 31, 2024, as well as an equivalent amount of state funds to *implement or supplement the implementation of* one or more activities to enhance, expand, or strengthen HCBS under the Medicaid program.
 - Must supplement and not supplant existing HCBS funding
 - Comes with a Maintenance of Effort requirement

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

Current Spending Plan Proposal & Estimated Expenditures (Still under CMS partial approval)

- LTSS programs \$128.4 million
 - 75% used for a 5.2% rate increase, effective 11/1/2021
 - O 25% \$32.1 million will be incorporated as a one-time rate increase
- Behavioral health services and programs \$188.8 million
 - 75% used for a **5.4% rate increase**, effective 11/1/2021
 - 25% \$47.2 million to be used for Certified Peer Recovery Support Services (CPRS) program for SUD (still pending review and approval by CMS)
- Developmental Disabilities Administration \$241 million
 - 75% used for a **5.5% rate increase**, retroactive to 4/1/2021 (ARPA start date)
 - 25% \$60 million
 - \$50 million in <u>one-time supplemental payments</u> to providers for transition, workforce investment, supplies and equipment, and innovative programs and service
 - \$4.5 million in competitive grants for development and implementation of new HCBS business models
 - \$5.5 million to be spent on <u>administrative costs</u> related to grant administration, expediting new placements in HCBS (from waiting list), and to improve processing of person-centered plans.
