What is an Advance Directive?

- A useful, legal way for an individual (or declarant) to specify medical care they want or do not want, particularly treatment preferences in an emergency or near end of life
 - Can include the name of a health care agent (or proxy) to make decisions for a declarant if they are unable to do so themselves
- Electronic advance directives allow this important information to be created, updated, and shared securely with treating health care providers



BACKGROUND



Timeline

- 2011 The Maryland Health Care Commission (MHCC) was awarded \$1.6 million by the Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology (ONC) to explore options to facilitate the availability of electronic advance directives
- 2012 The Secretary of the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) provided MHCC with additional startup funding to pilot the exchange of electronic advance directives through the State-Designated Health Information Exchange (HIE), the Chesapeake Regional Information System for our Patients (CRISP)



Timeline (Continued...)

- 2013 The MHCC issued a Request for Proposals to identify a vendor to implement a statewide electronic advance directives system that health care providers could access through CRISP; ADVault (dba MyDirectives.com) was competitively selected to collaborate with CRISP to build an interface between its cloud-based advance directive service and CRISP
- **2014** An interface between the ADVault repository and CRISP was launched
- 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2022 Legislation passed aiming to expand use of cloud-based technology to support diffusion of electronic advance directives statewide and requiring MHCC to coordinate accessibility of advance care planning documents in the State



STATE RECOGNITION **OF AN** ELECTRONIC ADVANCE DIRECTIVES **SERVICE**

About State Recognition





- Available to vendors offering an electronic advance directives service that provides consumers the option to create, upload, share, and update their advance directive
- Demonstrates a vendor meets certain criteria or standards for privacy and security, independent audits, education, reporting, and technical provisions
- A prerequisite for a vendor to integrate with CRISP
- Valid for three years, unless suspended or revoked by MHCC



INFORMATION SHEET

Overview



- State law requires development of an Advance Directives Information Sheet with specific written statements, including options for creating an electronic advance directive
- Managed care organizations (and others) are required make the information sheet available:
 - During enrollment and in enrollee publications
 - On their website
 - At an enrollee's request



Advance care planning is a widely recognized way to support patient self-determination, facilitate decision making, and promote better care at the end of life (<u>AMA</u>). Regardless of health status, everyone over the age of 18 is encouraged to think about and document their values and treatment preferences to guide future medical decisions about their care. This includes appointing a health care agent. Your Health Info Your Rights Advance Directives Resources FAQs **Creating and Sharing Your Advance Directive** Regardless of health status, everyone over the age of 18 is encouraged to think about and document their values and treatment preferences to guide future medical decisions about their care. This includes appointing a health care agent. Thinking about the types of treatment you would or wouldn't like to receive and potential outcomes is important before a medical crisis occurs. Start the conversation with people you trust. Document your preferences in an advance directive, and then talk to your health care provider about securely storing a copy in their electronic ADVANCE HEALTH CARE DIRECTIVE health record system. You can also consider creating and storing your advance directive in an online service like MyDirectives.com. Pursuant to Marvland regulations (COMAR § 10.25.19), the Marvland Health Care Commission maintains rigorous criteria, including privacy and security standards, for recognizing advance directive services that are authorized to connect to CRISP, the Maryland-designated Health Information Exchange. Currently, the following services have been recognized by the Maryland Health Care Commission and vetted through its criteria (COMAR 10.25.19),
