23-0003A Peer Recovery Support Services	Att. 3.1A pg. 21-27, 29-36 Att. 4.19B pg. 17,17A	Effective June 1, 2023, the Maryland Department of Health is amending the State Plan to include coverage for peer recovery support services within the state’s Other Diagnostic, Screening, Preventive and Rehabilitative Services benefit and the Mandatory Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) benefit. Individual peer support services will be reimbursed at a rate of \$16.38 per 15-minute unit, and group peer support services will be reimbursed at a rate of \$4.55 per 15-minute unit.	3/29/2023	<i>*Requesting 6/1/23 effective date</i>

23-0001 CHIP HSI – Lead		This amendment will be used to combat factors in the home that contribute to asthma and elevated blood lead levels in low-income children by aligning with CDC recommendations for elevated blood lead levels (BLL) by reducing the blood lead reference value (BLRV) from 5 µg/dL to 3.5 µg/dL, and by expanding the service area for Program #2 to additional jurisdictions.	5/16/2023	<i>*Requesting 7/1/23 effective date</i>
