MY 2022 HealthChoice Quality Assurance Results

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EPSDT/Healthy Kids Medical Record Review

- The EPSDT/Healthy Kids Medical Record Review is conducted to improve accessibility and to ensure the availability of quality health care for children and adolescents through 20 years of age.
- The annual assessment is performed by MDH's external quality review organization, Qlarant Quality Solutions.
- EPSDT elements within a component are weighted equally, scored, and added together to derive the final component score. MDH has established 80% as the minimum compliance score for each component.

Updated Performance Monitoring Results

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EPSDT/Healthy Kids Review - Performance Monitoring Guidelines

Minor Problem

 Receives less than 80% in one or more components for a review year.

Moderate Problem

 Receives less than 80% in one or more components for two review years -- this score could be for the same component or different components

Major Problem

 Receives less than 80% in one or more components for three consecutive years, or for three years within a five-year period – this score could be for the same component or different components

HealthChoice Population Health Incentive Program

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Population Health Incentive Program (PHIP)

The HealthChoice Population Health Incentive Program (PHIP) is an incentive program designed to improve quality by awarding financial incentives to MCOs for meeting or exceeding defined benchmarks or demonstrating significant improvement in a subset of HEDIS measures and state-developed encounter data measures.



PHIP Incentive Rounds

There are two rounds of incentives available in PHIP:

Round 1 (Two Tiers)

- Tier 1: Comparison of HEDIS performance measures to national benchmarks and non-HEDIS measures to HealthChoice benchmarks
- Tier 2: Determining meaningful measure improvement compared to prior year performance

Round 2

Rewards plans who earned more than 80% of Round 1 incentives and performed well on the HEDIS Performance Monitoring Policy requirements for the measurement year with a bonus payment

PHIP Round 1, Tier 1 - Performance

Tier 1: Performance incentives are intended to reward strong performance in the measurement year.

Level of Performance	Benchmark	Incentive Awarded
Superlative	At or above the 90 th percentile of Medicaid HMOs nationwide (HEDIS) or among Maryland MCOs (non-HEDIS)	100% of Incentive
Very Strong	Between the 75th to 89th percentiles (inclusive) of Medicaid HMOs nationwide (HEDIS) or among Maryland MCOs (non-HEDIS)	67% of Incentive
Strong	Between the 50th to 74th percentiles (inclusive) of Medicaid HMOs nationwide (HEDIS) or among Maryland MCOs (non-HEDIS)	33% of Incentive
No Incentive	Below the 50th percentile of all Medicaid HMOs nationwide (HEDIS) or among Maryland MCOs (non-HEDIS)	No Incentive



PHIP Round 1, Tier 2 - Improvement

Tier 2: Improvement incentives are intended to reward year-over-year improvement.

Up to one-third (1/3) of the Round 1 incentives can be earned through improvement for MCOs that do not earn full performance incentives.



PHIP Round 2

In **Round 2**, unallocated program-wide funds from Round 1 are given to MCOs that meet the following qualifying criteria:

- The MCO earned above 80% of possible Round 1 incentives,
 AND
- The MCO did not receive HEDIS Performance Monitoring Policy findings for the measurement year.

Incentive payments from Round 2 may not exceed 1% of capitation in total across both rounds of incentives for any individual MCO.

PHIP Measures for MY 2022

HEDIS Measures

- Asthma Medication Ratio
- Continued Opioid Use (COU): ≥ 31 Days Covered
- Hemoglobin A1c Control for Patients with Diabetes: Poor HbA1c Control (>9%)
- Lead Screening in Children*
- Prenatal and Postpartum Care: Postpartum Care
- Prenatal and Postpartum
 Care: Timeliness of Prenatal
 Care

MDH-Developed Measures (Homegrown)

- Ambulatory Care Visits for SSI Adults
- Ambulatory Care Visits for SSI Children
- Lead Screenings for Children – Ages 12 to 23 Months*



^{*} Each lead measure is valued at $\frac{1}{2}$ of an incentive.

PHIP Incentive Valuation

Each PHIP incentive's valuation is **one-eighth of 0.5% of the MCO's total capitation for the measurement year**, except for the lead screening measures.

Each lead screening measure is valued at one-sixteenth of 0.5% of the MCO's total capitation for the measurement year.

These incentives are funded outside of the MCOs' capitation rates. Unawarded incentive dollars return to a non-lapsing fund.
