* "Other" race/ethnicity category includes Native Americans, Pacific Islanders, and Alaskan Natives due to small cell sizes. Those whose race data is unknown are also included in "Other."

Summary and Key Findings

- When compared with the April 2023 enrollment baseline, some groups are retaining coverage better than baseline. These groups are:
 - Children (ages 18 and under)
 - Black and African American population
 - Baltimore City
- Other groups, however, are experiencing more terminations. These groups include:
 - Adults under age 65
 - Washington Suburban area (Prince George’s and Montgomery Counties)
 - Western Maryland
- MDH utilizes federal guidance to categorize disenrollments as procedural and non-procedural.
 - MDH is focused on preventing *procedural disenrollments*, who are largely individuals who have not completed their renewal paperwork.
 - *Non-procedural disenrollments* are people who have submitted their renewal paperwork and been found ineligible (e.g., their income is now too high).

Next Steps

- MDH is targeting additional outreach to certain zip codes with high procedural disenrollment rates. This includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - Increased presence in independent convenience stores, mini-marts, and bodegas;
 - Expanded bus shelter and light rail advertising;
 - Increased radio advertisement frequency; and
 - Additional billboard advertising in key Western Maryland markets.
- MDH is working to expand outreach into laundromats (beginning January 2024).
- MDH continues to inform stakeholders of the [Medicaid Check-In](#) campaign and provide them with pertinent information to enable targeted community outreach.
- MDH will continue to assess disenrollment data and strategize on how to reach certain populations accordingly.

Data Limitations:

- The MMIS2 data used here are as of the last day of the month. MDH public reporting may follow a different schedule and use additional data sources, causing the most recent data to differ from public reporting.
 - Closure actions reported by eligibility systems at the end of a month do not take effect in MMIS until the end of the following month due to adverse action notification requirements.
- Individuals procedurally disenrolled may have since come back into coverage. This data indicates all individuals who had a disenrollment as of the end of November 2023.
- Due to CMS guidance, Maryland paused procedural disenrollments in August 2023, September 2023, and October 2023 and reinstated children procedurally disenrolled in May, June, and July.
- In public reporting, participants whose renewal or closure takes place outside their Scheduled Redet Month (“off-cycle”) are listed in public reporting as “New Applications” or “Pending”. Here, those participants are listed with the outcome of their renewal (e.g., Disenrolled-Non-Procedural).
