Subject: On July 1, 2024, Maryland Medicaid will increase certain provider rates for community-based behavioral health and applied behavioral analysis (ABA) services, pursuant to Senate Bill 360/House Bill 350 Fiscal Year 2025 budget bill. The impacts on total funds and the program-specific federal fund splits are detailed below. **Adult Residential Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Services:** For dates of service beginning July 1, 2024, the Maryland Medical Assistance reimbursement rates for Adult Residential SUD services will increase by 3 percent. This represents an estimated \$8,606,689 increase in total funds (67.87 percent general funds \$5,841,945; 32.13 percent federal funds \$2,764,744).

**Behavioral Health Crisis Services:** For dates of services beginning July 1, 2024, the Maryland Medical Assistance reimbursement rates for Behavioral Health Crisis Services will increase by 3 percent. For Mobile Crisis Team services, this represents an estimated \$354,424 increase in total funds (15 percent general funds \$53,164; 85 percent federal funds \$301,260). For Behavioral Health Crisis Stabilization Center services, this represents an estimated \$82,935 increase in total funds (34.4 percent general funds \$28,530; 65.6 percent federal funds \$28,530).

**Community-Based Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Services:** For dates of service beginning July 1, 2024, the Maryland Medical Assistance reimbursement rates for Community Based SUD services will increase by 3 percent. This represents an estimated \$12,022,826 increase in total funds (37.06 percent general funds \$4,456,001; 62.93 percent federal funds \$7,566,825).

**Specialty Mental Health Services:** For dates of service beginning July 1, 2024, the Maryland Medical Assistance reimbursement rates for mental health services will increase by 3 percent. This represents an estimated \$27,901,227 increase in total funds (34.4 percent general funds \$9,598,022; 65.6 percent federal funds \$18,303,205).

Effective July 1, 2024, the reimbursement rates for community based Mental Health services funded through Maryland's Public Behavioral Health System will increase by 3 percent. This represents an estimated \$2,574,855 increase in total funds (100 percent general funds).

**Mental Health Targeted Case Management (TCM) for Adults:** For dates of service beginning July 1, 2024, the Maryland Medical Assistance reimbursement rates for TCM for adults will increase by 3 percent. This rate change represents an estimated \$330,406 increase in total funds (39.93 percent general funds \$131,959; 60.06 percent federal funds \$198,447).

**Mental Health Targeted Case Management (TCM) for Children:** For dates of service beginning July 1, 2024, the Maryland Medical Assistance reimbursement rates for TCM for children will increase by 3 percent. This rate change represents an estimated \$359,589 increase in total funds (34.66 percent general funds \$124,636; 65.34 percent federal funds \$234,952).

**Behavioral Health Health Home:** For dates of service beginning July 1, 2024, the Maryland Medical Assistance Behavioral Health, Health Home program reimbursement rates will increase by 3 percent. This rate change represents an estimated \$292,638 increase in total funds (50 percent general funds \$146,319; 50 percent federal funds \$146,319).

**Therapeutic Behavioral Services:** For dates of service beginning July 1, 2024, the Maryland Medical Assistance reimbursement rates for Therapeutic Behavioral Services will increase by 3 percent. This rate change represents an estimated \$215,771 increase in total funds (34.4 percent general funds \$74,225; 65.6 percent federal funds \$141,546).

**Applied Behavioral Analysis:** For dates of service beginning July 1, 2024, the Maryland Medical Assistance reimbursement rates for covered Applied Behavioral Analysis services will increase by 3 percent. This represents an estimated \$3,404,488 increase in total funds (34.40 percent general funds \$1,171,144, 65.60 percent federal funds \$2,233,344).
