



Therapeutic Integration Sites for Compliance with Home and Community-Based Settings Requirements (Final Rule)

Public Comment

The purpose of the Home and Community-Based Settings Final Rule is to ensure that individuals receive Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) in settings that are integrated and that support full access to the greater community. These requirements maximize the opportunities for participants in HCBS programs to have access to the benefits of community living and to receive services in the most integrated setting.

The Maryland Department of Health (MDH) identified a total of twenty-eight (28) Therapeutic Integration provider sites. As of September 19, 2022, two (2) of those twenty-eight (28) sites were determined closed. As of October 31, 2022, twenty-six (26) provider sites have been assessed and validated as compliant with the HCBS Final Rule requirements. In accordance with the federal HCBS regulations found at 42 CFR Section 441.301(c)(4)(5) and Section 441.710 (a)(1)(2), the MDH has listed the provider sites below for public comment review:
