In accordance with Maryland Criminal Law § 5-202, the following Controlled Substances are scheduled differently in the State of Maryland than the Federal Government's DEA Scheduled Controlled Substances.

Schedule I

The following substance, is added to the Maryland Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, Schedule I of the Criminal Law Article, §5-402, Annotated Code of Maryland:

4-Methoxymethcathinone (Methedrone, bk-PMMA, PMMC); also known as "bath salts"

Schedule III

The following substances are added to the Maryland Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, Schedule III of the Criminal Law Article, §5-404, Annotated Code of Maryland:

- Butalbital, Acetaminophen, caffeine C-III Fioricet®
- Opium < or = 100mg per 100Gm or 100ml or not more than 5mg per dosage unit C-III
