I. Welcome and General Announcements

Meeting called to order at 10:05am, welcoming the committee members and others in attendance

II. ANAB Announcements/Updates

Brad Putnam, for Melissa Kennedy. Remote Techniques being explored by ANAB for 2022.

III. General Forensic Announcements

Chris D'Amario completed FY21 annual report documentation. Letters not mailed yet.

Forensic Genealogy Bill regulation met together regarding licensing individual genealogists. Chris explained the October 2021 bill to FLAC.

Dan Katz pointed out how well the workgroup is going. It includes FLAC members Rana and Kristen. Ray Wickenheiser. Mark Wilson, Teresa Vreeland, CeCe Moore are the subject matters experts. The manner in which genetic genealogy is performed varies by subcontractor. Bode outsources SNP analysis, and a genetic genealogist.

Parabon, are more of a informatics lab, that takes a different approach.

Potentially three different sets are required. SNP, Bioinformatics, and Genetic Genealogy search aspects should be included. A structure has been established for the FGGS Universe. We have made some progress for the MDH responsibilities.

Lorraine reached out to Shannon Dickson at University of MD for joining the group

IV Legislative update HB 863, HB866/SB766, HB259/SB355 – Chris

Bill HB863 removing Letter of Exception requirement. Dan does not think there will be an impact whether the bill passes or not. Genetic Privacy bill and Biometric data bills are also being voted on. Neither of these last two bills have forensic repercussions.

IV. New Business

Rana Dellarocco, mentioned creating a Forensic Science Commission. Where the forensic side, and the legal side could discuss things outside of certification regulations. A need beyond FLAC could be met, for real time issues in the forensic community. Could also help with starting University Forensic Programs. FLAC consensus is that it is overall a good idea to establish an FSC.
