Re: Emergency Preparedness Requirements

Date: August 4, 2017

The “Medicare and Medicaid Programs: Emergency Preparedness Requirements for Medicare and Medicaid Participating Providers and Suppliers” establishes national emergency preparedness requirements for participating providers and certified suppliers to plan adequately for both natural and man-made disasters, and coordinate with Federal, state, regional and local emergency preparedness systems. These requirements went into effect on November 16, 2016. Health care providers and suppliers affected by this rule must comply and fully implement it by **November 15, 2017**.

Because the individual regulations for each specific provider and supplier share a majority of standard provisions, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has developed Appendix Z to provide consistent interpretive guidance and survey procedures located in a single document. CMS finalized and issued Appendix Z on June 6, 2017.

Compliance with the Emergency Preparedness requirements will be determined in conjunction with the existing survey process for health and safety compliance surveys or Life Safety Code (LSC) surveys for each provider and supplier type. Surveyors will cite non-compliance with these requirements beginning **November 16, 2017**.
