PRE-CHARGE CONSENT ORDER

Background

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) received credible information from the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs indicating that American Life Pharmacy (the “Pharmacy”), located and licensed in Michigan, had dispensed prescription drugs to patients in Maryland before obtaining licensure in Maryland as a non-resident pharmacy.

In lieu of instituting formal proceedings against the Pharmacy, in accordance with the Maryland Pharmacy Act, Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-101 *et seq.*, the Board and the Pharmacy have agreed to resolve this matter as set forth in this Pre-Charge Consent Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. American Life Pharmacy is a pharmacy located and licensed in Garden City, Michigan under Permit Number 5301012637.
2. The Pharmacy’s permit in Michigan is currently active and in good standing.
3. On or about May 24, 2022, the Board received notification from a pharmacist specialist with the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs indicating that the Pharmacy dispensed prescription products to Maryland patients prior to obtaining licensure in Maryland.

4. Further investigation determined that the Pharmacy dispensed approximately seven (7) prescriptions to various Maryland patients prior to obtaining its Maryland non-resident pharmacy permit.
5. None of the prescriptions dispensed into Maryland before the Pharmacy obtained a Maryland permit were controlled dangerous substances.
6. The Pharmacy was originally obtained issued a non-resident pharmacy permit by the Maryland Board of Pharmacy on April 23, 2024. The Pharmacy allowed the permit to lapse on May 31, 2024.
7. On June 4, 2024, the Pharmacy submitted an application for reinstatement of its Maryland non-resident pharmacy permit.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that American Life Pharmacy is subject to discipline in accordance with Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. §§ 12-401, 12-403(e), 12-703, and 12-707(e).

ORDER

Based upon an affirmative vote of a majority of the Board under the authority of Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-101, *et seq.*, it this 23rd day of September 2024, hereby,

ORDERED that American Life Pharmacy, Permit No. P08890, shall pay a FINE in the amount of \$1,000.00, payable to the Maryland Board of Pharmacy within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order, and mailed to:


NOTE: Please include the case number, 24-377, on your check or money order to ensure proper assignment to this case; and be it further,

ORDERED that the Pharmacy, shall comply with all laws and regulations governing the dispensing of prescription drugs and devices into the State of Maryland by non-resident pharmacies; and be it further,

ORDERED that in the event that the Pharmacy violates any of the terms above, the Board, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing, and a determination of a violation, may impose any disciplinary sanction it deems appropriate, including suspension, revocation, and fines, said violation being proven by a preponderance of the evidence; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order and as such is a public document pursuant to Md. Code Ann., General Provisions Article § 4-301, *et seq.*



4. The Pharmacy acknowledges the legal authority and the jurisdiction of the Board to enter and enforce this Pre-Charge Consent Order.

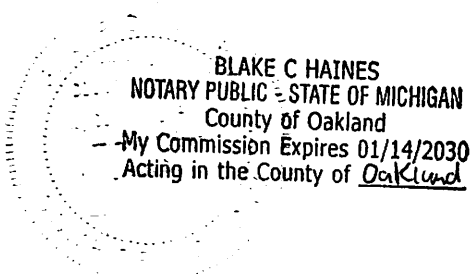
