ORDER OF MODIFICATION

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) entered into a Consent Order, dated April 15, 2024, with Vivian Berinyuy, R.Ph., (the “Respondent”), in which the Board imposed certain disciplinary sanctions for various violations of the Maryland Pharmacy Act. Specifically, the Consent Order placed the Respondent on probation for a minimum of three (3) years, during which time the Respondent, among other things, was “prohibited from participating in any aspect of the dispensing process”. The Board subsequently found, through its monitoring of the Respondent’s compliance with the terms of the Consent Order, that the Respondent was dispensing non-controlled prescriptions at a community pharmacy (“Pharmacy A”).

FINDINGS

1. The Respondent entered into a Consent Order with the Board, dated April 15, 2024, in which the Respondent was sanctioned with a revocation, all stayed, and a minimum period of probation for three (3) years.
2. The Respondent’s probationary period included several terms and conditions, one of which was that the Respondent was “prohibited from participating in any aspect of the dispensing process.”
3. In or around May 2024, the Respondent began practicing at Pharmacy A, a community pharmacy, and dispensing non-controlled prescriptions in violation of the terms of the

Consent Order.

4. The Respondent asserts that she misunderstood the terms of the Consent Order and believed that it only prohibited the dispensing of controlled dangerous substances.
5. The Respondent has otherwise been compliant with the other terms of the Consent Order.

ORDER

It is this 27th day of August, 2025, by an affirmative vote of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, hereby,

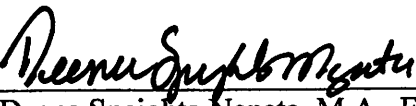
ORDERED that the Consent Order, dated April 15, 2024, be modified to extend the probationary period to re-commence on the date of this Order; that is, the Respondent's license shall be placed on PROBATION for a minimum of THREE (3) years, commencing on the date of this Order of Modification; and be it further,

ORDERED that the Respondent may petition the Board for modification of probation after one (1) year from the date of this Order, provided that the Respondent is fully compliant with all other terms and conditions of the Consent Order, dated April 15, 2024; and be it further,

ORDERED that all other terms and conditions of the April 15, 2024 Consent Order shall remain in full force and effect; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Maryland Annotated Code, General Provisions Article, Section 4-333.
