## ORDER OF MODIFICATION

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") is in receipt of a petition from David Bourgeios, License No. 24608, requesting modification of a certain term of probation as set forth in the Board's Supplemental Order, dated September 29, 2023. The Supplemental Order placed Dr. Bourgeios' license on probation for a period of three (3) years based on issues with substance use disorder. Specifically, Dr. Bourgeois requests modification of his probationary conditions regarding: (1) the frequency of required urinalysis; and (2) submission of pharmacy employer reports to the Board. Upon consideration of Dr. Bourgeois' petition and additional information provided by Pharmacists Rehabilitation Services (PRS), the Board voted to deny the requests to modify the frequency of employer reports, but to grant the request to modify the frequency of urine screenings as set forth below.

## **ORDER**

It is this 13<sup>th</sup> day of Janvay 2025, by an affirmative vote of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, hereby,

**ORDERED** that the Supplemental Order, dated September 29, 2023, be modified to change the probationary condition requiring weekly random urines screens to requiring random urine screens every other week, to be directed and monitored by PRS; and be it further,

**ORDERED** that all other terms and conditions of the September 29, 2023, Supplemental Order shall remain in full force and effect; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Maryland Annotated Code, General Provisions Article, Section 4-333.
