ORDER FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION

Pursuant to Md. State Govt. Code Ann. §10-226 (c)(2) (2014 Repl. Vol.), the State Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") hereby summarily suspends the registration of Destiny T. Cameron, Registration Number: T13561 ("the Respondent"), to practice as a registered pharmacy technician, under the Maryland Pharmacy Act (the "Act"), Md. Health Occ. Code Ann. ("H. O.") §§12-101 *et seq.* (2014 Repl. Vol.). This Order is based on the following investigative findings, which the Board has reason to believe are true:¹

INVESTIGATIVE FINDINGS

1. At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent was registered to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of Maryland. The Respondent was originally registered to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland on or about October 21, 2013.

2. The Respondent's registration expires on May 31, 2015.

3. At all times relevant hereto, Respondent worked as pharmacy technician at a pharmacy located in Baltimore, Maryland ("Pharmacy A").²

4. On or about October 10, 2014, Pharmacy A informed the Board that one hundred and sixty eight (168) tablets of Oxycodone HCL 5 mg. and one hundred and twenty (120) tablets of Hydrocodone-APAP 5 mg-325 were missing from Pharmacy A.

5. On or about October 17, 2014, the Respondent was questioned by a Pharmacy A loss prevention employee about the missing medication that was reported to the Board.

6. The Respondent admitted to a Pharmacy A investigator that she had taken one hundred and sixty eight (168) tablets of Oxycodone HCL 5 mg and one hundred and twenty (120) tablets of Hydrocodone-APAP 5 mg-325 from Pharmacy A. This was the same medication that Pharmacy A had reported to the Board as missing from Pharmacy A.

7. The Respondent also admitted that she obtained the medication to give to someone else.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing investigative findings, the Board concludes that the public health, safety, and welfare imperatively require emergency action in this case, pursuant to Md. State Gov't. Code Ann. § 10-226(c) (2).

ORDER

Based on the foregoing Investigative Findings and Conclusions of Law, it is this 3rd day of March 2015, by a majority of the quorum of the Board, hereby

ORDERED that the registration issued to the Respondent to practice as pharmacy technician in the State of Maryland under registration number T13562 is hereby **SUMMARILY SUSPENDED**; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent is prohibited from practicing as a pharmacy technician in the State of Maryland; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent shall immediately return all registrations to the Board; and it is further

ORDERED that this ORDER FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION is a PUBLIC DOCUMENT as defined in Md. General Provisions Code Ann. §§ 4-101 *et seq.* (2014 Repl. Vol.)
