SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Background

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") is in receipt of a petition from Jalyssa Renee Dixon, Registration No. 21664, requesting to lift the suspension of her registration in accordance with a Consent Order, dated May 5, 2025. The Consent Order provides that Ms. Dixon may petition to lift the suspension of her registration after one (1) year, effective May 23, 2024, provided that she has fully complied with the terms the order. The Board finds that Ms. Dixon has been compliant with the terms of suspension. Therefore, the Board has voted to lift the suspension and place Ms. Dixon's registration on immediate probation with terms and conditions as set forth in the May 5, 2025 Consent Order and reiterated below.

ORDER

Based on an affirmative vote of the Board, it is this 25th day of August 2025, hereby,

ORDERED that the suspension of Ms. Dixon's registration is LIFTED; and be it further,

ORDERED that Ms. Dixon's registration be placed on immediate PROBATION for at
least THREE (3) YEARS; and be it further,

ORDERED that during the probationary period, Ms. Dixon:

- (1) Shall be prohibited from working as a pharmacy technician in a setting in which she has access to controlled dangerous substances;
- (2) Shall ensure that Ms. Dixon's pharmacist supervisor submit quarterly employer reports to the Board, utilizing the Board's form, regarding her professional performance;
- (3) Shall be prohibited from working as a floating pharmacy technician; and be it further,

ORDERED that after one (1) year of probation, Ms. Dixon may petition the Board to modify her probationary terms provided that she has fully complied with the terms of probation and does not have any pending complaints filed against her; and be it further,

ORDERED that after three (3) years of probation, Ms. Dixon may petition to terminate probation provided that she has fully complied with the probationary terms and has no pending complaints against her; and be it further,

ORDERED that Ms. Dixon shall at all times cooperate with the Board in the monitoring, supervision, and investigation of her compliance with the terms and conditions of this Order; and be it further.

ORDERED that Ms. Dixon's failure to fully cooperate with the Board shall be deemed a violation of the terms of probation and a violation of this Order; and be it further,

ORDERED that in the event the Board finds for any good faith reason that Ms. Dixon has violated any of the conditions of probation herein, or in the event that the Board finds for any good faith reason that Ms. Dixon has committed a violation of Title 12 of the Health Occupations Article or regulations adopted thereunder, the Board may take further disciplinary action against Ms. Dixon's registration provided that she is given notice and an opportunity for a hearing, or issue a summary suspension if appropriate; and be it further,

ORDERED that Ms. Dixon shall bear the expenses associated with this Order; and be it further,

ORDERED that this document constitutes a formal disciplinary action of the Maryland State Board of Pharmacy and is therefore a public document for purposes of public disclosure, pursuant to the Public Information Act, General Provisions Art. § 4-333, and shall be posted and reported in accordance with State and federal laws.
