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ORDER OF MODIFICATION

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) is in receipt of a petition from Patrick Donohue, License No. 21664, requesting modification of a certain probationary condition as set forth in the Board’s Supplemental Order, dated May 21, 2025. The Supplemental Order placed Mr. Donohue’s license on probation for a period of two (2) years based on prior impairment issues. Specifically, Mr. Donohue requests modification of his probationary condition to decrease the frequency of his required random urine screens from four (4) times per month to twice a month. Upon consideration of Mr. Donohue’s request and his full compliance with his terms of probation and PRS contract, the Board voted to modify the terms of probation to decrease the frequency of urine screens to twice a month.

ORDER

It is this 3rd day of August 2026, by an affirmative vote of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, hereby,

ORDERED that Supplemental Order, dated May 21, 2025, be modified to decrease the frequency of the required random urine screenings from four (4) times per month to twice a month; and be it further,

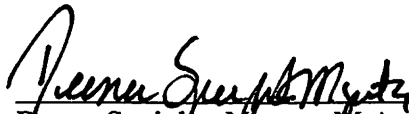
ORDERED that all other terms and conditions of the May 21, 2025, Supplemental Order shall remain in full force and effect; and be it further,
