ORDER TERMINATING SUMMARY SUSPENSION

On August 10, 2017, the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) issued an Order of Summary Suspension summarily suspending the registration to practice as a pharmacy technician held by Ashley Nicole Glasgow (the “Respondent”), Registration No. T19375. The summary suspension was based on criminal charges pending against the Respondent on various drug and alcohol offenses.

On October 23, 2017, the Respondent entered a guilty plea and received probation before judgment on the charge of “driving under the influence of alcohol per se” and the State entered a *nolle prosequi* on the drug-related charges. On May 31, 2018, the Respondent’s registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland expired and was not renewed by the Respondent. For these reasons, the Board finds that the public health, safety, or welfare no long imperatively requires emergency action in the form of a suspension of the Respondent’s registration to practice as a pharmacy technician pursuant to Md. Code Ann., State Gov’t § 10-226(c)(2).

ORDER

It is therefore, this 24th day of August, 2018, by an affirmative vote of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, hereby:

ORDERED that the summary suspension of the Respondent’s registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland, as ordered by the Board’s August 10, 2017 Order for Summary Suspension, is **TERMINATED** and has no further force or effect; and it is further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to Maryland Code Ann., General Provisions § 4-333(b).
