PRE-CHARGE CONSENT ORDER

Background

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) received an application for a pharmacist’s license from Mujjahid Huq, R.Ph. (the “Applicant”) on June 19, 2025. During the application process, the Applicant disclosed that he had been criminally indicted in New York on June 25, 2025, based on allegations of healthcare fraud.

In lieu of instituting formal proceedings against the Applicant, in accordance with the Maryland Pharmacy Act, Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-101 *et seq.*, the Board and Applicant, have agreed to resolve this matter as set forth in this Pre-Charge Consent Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or about June 19, 2025, the Applicant submitted an application for a pharmacist’s license in Maryland.
2. The Applicant currently resides in New York and holds a license to practice pharmacy in New York under License No. 049506.
3. During the application process, the Applicant disclosed, “In Brooklyn, NY, around June 30, 2025, former employees made false allegations and stole from me, leading to unfounded charges including health care fraud, unlawful monetary transactions, and conspiracy...”

4. Subsequently, the Board obtained a copy of a Grand Jury Indictment issued against the Applicant in the U.S. District Court, Eastern District of New York on June 25, 2025 (CR No. 1:25-cr-00213FB).
5. The above Indictment alleges that, among other things, the Applicant engaged in a fraudulent billing scheme through his direct and indirect ownership of various pharmacies located in New York from January 2018 to December 2023.
6. The Applicant's criminal proceeding is pending. A trial date is currently scheduled for May 4, 2026, in the U.S. District Court, Eastern District of New York.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that Mujjahid Huq, R.Ph., Applicant, is subject to formal action in accordance with Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-302(b) and 12-313(b).

ORDER

Based upon an affirmative vote of the Board under the authority of Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. Art. § 12-313, it this 28th day of January, 2026, hereby,

ORDERED that the Applicant may be issued a pharmacist's license in Maryland provided that:

- (1) The Applicant otherwise complies with all licensure requirements under Health Occ. Art. § 12-305 and COMAR 10.34.02; and
- (2) Pending resolution of the criminal proceedings against the Applicant, the Applicant is prohibited from having any ownership interest, directly or indirectly, in a

pharmacy in Maryland, or from working in any capacity for a pharmacy in Maryland owned by a family member; and be it further,

ORDERED that the Board may initiate formal action against the Applicant subsequent to the resolution of the federal criminal proceedings against the Applicant; and be it further,

ORDERED that in the event that the Applicant violates any of the terms above, or any provision of the Maryland Pharmacy Act, the Board, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing, and a determination of a violation, may impose any disciplinary sanction it deems appropriate, including fines, probation, suspension and revocation, said violation being proven by a preponderance of the evidence; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order and as such is a public document pursuant to Md. Code Ann., General Provisions Article § 4-333.




