Notice of Deficiencies, Imposition of Civil Monetary Penalty, and
Opportunity for Hearing

Dear Faresha Alli:

On June 15, 2025, the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") attempted to conduct an inspection of Lupin Pharmaceuticals, located in Baltimore, Maryland (the "Distributor") to determine if the Distributor was in compliance with State laws and regulations. Upon arrival, the Board's inspector was notified by building security that the Distributor was no longer at that location and had not been there since March 2025. The inspector subsequently communicated with a representative of the Distributor who confirmed that the Distributor ceased operations in March 2025 and thereafter ultimately submitted written notification of the closing on November 20, 2025. The Board's records further indicate that notwithstanding the Distributor's closing in March 2025, the Distributor submitted a permit renewal application to the Board on May 2, 2025.

I. FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

The Board finds that the Distributor failed to submit written notification of the Distributor's closing of operations at least 30 days in advance and submit to a closing inspection.

Based upon the Distributor's failure to comply with the Board's regulations governing required information and procedures for ceasing to operate, the Board finds that the Distributor is in violation of the Maryland Pharmacy Act and the regulations adopted thereunder. Specifically, the Board finds the Distributor in violation of Health Occ. Art., § 12-6C-07 and COMAR 10.34.22.10B.

II. RECOMMENDED CIVIL MONETARY PENALTY

Under Maryland Health Occupations Article § 12-6C-11 and COMAR 10.34.11, the Board of Pharmacy has the authority to impose a civil monetary penalty based upon violations of the Maryland Pharmacy Act.

Based upon the Distributor's infractions above, the Board hereby recommends the imposition of a **civil monetary penalty of \$500.00**

In determining the recommended civil monetary penalty, the Board took into consideration the factors set forth in COMAR 10.34.11.08.

III. OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

If the Pharmacy disputes the findings, conclusions or the recommended civil monetary penalty, the Distributor may request an evidentiary hearing on the Board's decision in this matter. In the event that the Distributor requests an evidentiary hearing, the Board shall initiate formal proceedings which will include the opportunity for a full evidentiary hearing. The hearing will be held in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, Md. Code Ann. State Gov't § 10-201 *et seq.*, and COMAR 10.34.01. Any request for a hearing must be submitted in writing to Trina Leak, Pharm.D., Compliance Director, Maryland Board of Pharmacy, 4201 Patterson Ave., 5th Floor, Baltimore, Maryland 21215, **no later than thirty (30) days of the date of this Notice.**

Please be advised that at the hearing the Distributor would have the following rights: to be represented by counsel, to subpoena witnesses and evidence, to call witnesses on its own behalf, to present evidence, to cross-examine witnesses, to testify, and to present summation and argument. Should the Board find the Distributor guilty of the violations cited herein, the Board may reprimand, suspend or revoke the distributor's permit, impose civil penalties, or both. If the Distributor requests a hearing but fails to appear, the Board may nevertheless hear and determine the matter in its absence.

IV. OPTION TO PAY RECOMMENDED CIVIL MONETARY PENALTY

Alternatively, the Distributor may pay the recommended civil monetary penalty **within thirty (30) days** of the date of this Notice, in the form of a certified check or money order made payable to the Maryland Board of Pharmacy.
