ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION AND
REINSTATING PHARMACY LICENSE

By Order dated May 13, 1981 (the "1981 Order"), the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") found William J. McCormick, P.D. (the "Respondent") guilty of violating Article 43, §266(A)(c)(iii), (vii), (xii), (xiv), and (xvi) of the Annotated Code of Maryland. The Board revoked Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in Maryland, immediately stayed the revocation, and placed Respondent on probation subject to certain conditions (the "Conditions of Probation").

By letter dated May 16, 1984, Respondent petitioned the Board for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in Maryland without any conditions or restrictions. At its meeting on June 20, 1984, the Board reviewed Respondent's petition for reinstatement. Based on its review of that petition and the reports submitted to the Board by the persons monitoring Respondent's progress pursuant to the Conditions of Probation, the Board determined that Respondent had satisfactorily fulfilled all of the Conditions of Probation contained in the 1981 Order.

FINDING OF FACT

The Board finds that Respondent has satisfactorily complied with all the Conditions of Probation imposed by its 1981 Order.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The Board concludes as a matter of law that it is appropriate to terminate Respondent's Conditions of Probation and to reinstate his pharmacy license without any condition or restriction.

ORDER

UPON THE FOREGOING Finding of Fact and Conclusion of Law, it is this 14th day of July, 1984, by a unanimous vote of a quorum of the Board

ORDERED that effective as of the date of this Order, the Conditions of Probation imposed on Respondent's practice of pharmacy by the Board's 1981 Order are hereby **TERMINATED** and of no further force and effect; and be it further

ORDERED that Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of Maryland be **REINSTATED** without any condition or restriction whatsoever.
