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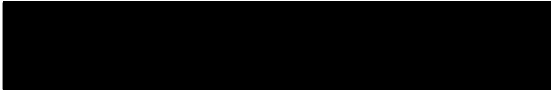

Dear Ms. Richardson and Ms. Gill:

On September 27, 2017, the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) issued an Order for Summary Suspension in the above-captioned matter. Ms. Richardson submitted a request for a show cause hearing on October 22, 2017. The Board held a show cause hearing on November 15, 2017. Ms. Richardson attended the hearing on that date on her own behalf. The State was represented by Roberta Gill, Administrative Prosecutor.

After considering the presentations at the hearing, the Board determined that it would not lift the summary suspension first imposed on September 27, 2017. The Board concluded that the arguments submitted and the responses to the Board's questions did not significantly change the Board's findings or conclusions regarding the danger to the public which would be posed by Ms. Richardson practicing as a pharmacy technician in Maryland.

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Under the Board regulations, COMAR 10.34.01.12, Ms. Richardson has the right to request a full evidentiary hearing before the Board on this matter. Any request for a hearing shall be made to the Board at the above address, attention Heather McLaughlin, with a copy sent to the Administrative Prosecutor. The hearing will be held in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act and the Board's regulations governing disciplinary proceedings.

Please be advised that in the event that an evidentiary hearing is held, Ms. Richardson has the following rights: to be represented by counsel, to subpoena witnesses, to call witnesses on her own behalf, to present evidence, to cross-examine witnesses, to testify, and to present summation and argument. If Ms. Richardson requests a hearing but fails to appear, the Board may nevertheless hear and determine the matter in her absence.

This letter constitutes an order of the Board resulting from formal disciplinary action and is therefore a public document in accordance with the Maryland Public Information Act, Md. Code Ann., Gen. Provisions § 4-333.
