CONSENT ORDER

Background

On or about September 24, 2020, Marcus Robinson submitted an application to renew his pharmacy technician registration to the Maryland State Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”), in accordance with Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-6B-07(c). On his renewal application, Mr. Robinson answered “yes” to a question about having current or pending charges against him in any court of law. Upon request, Mr. Robinson provided an explanation to the Board indicating that he had been arrested for possession of a firearm. A review of the Maryland Judiciary Case Search revealed that Mr. Robinson pled guilty to one misdemeanor count in October 2020.

In lieu of instituting formal proceedings against Mr. Robinson’s registration, in accordance with the Maryland Pharmacy Act, Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-6B-01 *et seq.*, the Board has offered Mr. Robinson the opportunity to resolve this matter by agreeing to the terms set forth in this Consent Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. At all times relevant hereto, Mr. Robinson was registered as a pharmacy technician, Registration No. T19827. Mr. Robinson was initially registered as a pharmacy technician on July 11, 2017. His registration is currently active and is set to expire on September 30, 2022.
2. On or about September 24, 2020, Mr. Robinson applied for renewal of his pharmacy technician registration. On his renewal application, Mr. Robinson answered “yes” to the question “Excluding minor traffic violations, are you currently under arrest or released on bond, or are there any current or pending charges against you in any court of law?”
3. Upon request, Mr. Robinson provided an explanation of his charges to the Board. Mr. Robinson explained that he was riding as a passenger in a car when the driver was pulled over and the police discovered a firearm in the car. He explained that everyone in the car, including himself, was charged with possession of a firearm.
4. A subsequent review of the Maryland Judiciary Case Search indicated that Mr. Robinson pled guilty to one misdemeanor count of possession of a loaded handgun on October 29, 2020. He received a three-year sentence, all suspended, and two years of supervised probation.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that Mr. Robinson is subject to discipline pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-6B-02(b)(1).

ORDER

Based on an affirmative vote of the Board, it is this 14th day of October, 2022,
hereby:


ORDERED that upon the next renewal of Mr. Robinson's pharmacy technician registration, in September 2022, he shall submit to a State criminal history records check; and be it further,

ORDERED that in the event Mr. Robinson's criminal history records check indicates further criminal activity, the Board may impose further disciplinary action against his registration, including suspension or revocation, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing; and be it further,

ORDERED that Mr. Robinson shall be responsible for all costs associated with this Consent Order; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Gen. Provisions § 4-333(b).
