ORDER LIFTING SUSPENSION

On November 20, 2017, the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) issued an Order of Suspension of Registration for Delinquent Child Support (“Order of Suspension”) against Devin Eric Smith, Pharmacy Technician, Registration No. T03931 (the “Respondent”). The Board suspended the Respondent’s registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland due to his delinquent child support payments upon requests from the Baltimore City Office of the Child Support Enforcement Administration of the Maryland Department of Human Resources and the Anne Arundel County Office of the Child Support Enforcement Administration of the Maryland Department of Human Resources (collectively, the “Administration”), pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Fam. Law § 10-119.3(e)(2)(i) (2012 Repl. Vol.).


On or about May 22, 2019, the Board received a Notice to Reinstate the Respondent’s registration from the Anne Arundel County office of the Administration; on or about July 18, 2019, the Board received a Notice to Reinstate from the Baltimore City office. However, the Respondent’s registration expired on September 30, 2018; as such, the Board cannot reinstate his registration unless the Respondent complies with the requirements for reinstatement provided for in COMAR 10.34.34.10.

Therefore, pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Fam. Law § 10-119.3(k), on this 19th
day of August, 2019, by the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, it is hereby:

ORDERED that the suspension of the registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland held by Devin Eric Smith, Registration No. T03931, is **LIFTED**; and it is further,

ORDERED that upon receipt of a reinstatement application, the Board will reinstate the registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland held by Devin Eric Smith, Registration No. T03931, provided he is otherwise eligible for reinstatement as set forth in COMAR 10.34.34.10; and it is further,

ORDERED that this is a Final Order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and, as such, is a public document pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Gen. Provisions §4-333(b).
