ORDER OF MODIFICATION

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) is in receipt of a petition from Kyle Tang, License No. 25521, requesting modification of a certain probationary condition as set forth in the Board’s Supplemental Order Lifting Suspension, dated February 13, 2025. The Supplemental Order placed Mr. Tang’s license on probation for a period of three (3) years based on prior misconduct involving diversion of a controlled dangerous substance for personal use. Specifically, Mr. Tang requests modification of his probationary condition to decrease the frequency of his required random urine screens from weekly to monthly. Upon consideration of Mr. Tang’s request, the Board voted to modify the probationary condition to decrease the frequency from weekly to bi-weekly (i.e., every other week), as ordered below.

ORDER

It is this 20th day of April, 2026, by an affirmative vote of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, hereby,


ORDERED that Supplemental Order Lifting Suspension, dated February 13, 2025, be modified to decrease the frequency of the required random urine screenings from weekly to bi-weekly (i.e., every other week); and be it further,

ORDERED that all other terms and conditions of the February 13, 2025, Supplemental Order Lifting Suspension shall remain in full force and effect; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Maryland Annotated Code, General Provisions Article, Section 4-333.
