ORDER OF MODIFICATION

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") is in receipt of a petition from Matthew Vaccari, R.Ph., License No. 16372, requesting modification of certain terms of probation set forth in the Board's Order Lifting Suspension, dated January 26, 2015. The Order Lifting Suspension lifted the Board's prior suspension of Mr. Vaccari's license and placed his license on probation for a period of five (5) years. The Board's aforementioned disciplinary action was based on Mr. Vaccari's 2013 misconduct involving diversion of controlled dangerous substances and substance use disorder. The Order Lifting Suspension allows Mr. Vaccari to petition the Board for modification of probationary terms after one (1) year. Mr. Vaccari is requesting that the Board modify his probationary condition requiring weekly urine screenings. Upon consideration of Mr. Vaccari's petition and his full compliance with the probationary terms to date, the Board voted to modify the terms of probation as ordered below.

ORDER

It is this 2nd day of August, 2017, by an affirmative vote of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, hereby,

ORDERED that Probationary Term (1) contained in the Order Lifting Suspension, dated January 26, 2015, be modified as follows:

(1) Shall submit to random, Board-ordered urine screenings once a month; and, be it further

ORDERED that all other terms of the January 26, 2015, Order Lifting Suspension remain in full force and effect; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Maryland Annotated Code, General Provisions Article, Section 4-333.
